

Ship *Patron of New-Bedford* Bound Round New-Holland

Wednesday Aug. 28th. First part Steering to the S.E. under Double reefed Pop-sails at 5 P.M. headed to the W. under a close reefed M. Pop-sail and Spinnars, latter part employed in sail mending bent a new M. S. Sail Ye. so ends with Strong Gales from the S.E.W. Lat. by obs. 28-52 S. - Long. 110-10 E.

Thursday Aug. 29th. All these 24 hours Strong Gales from S.E.W. and equally lying under a close reefed main Pop-sail and Spinnars Lat. 28-36 S. - Long. 110-32 E.

Friday August 30th. First part Strong Gales from the S.E. Middle and latter part moderate at 6 Am. set the Pop-sails Double reefed, at 9 Am. let out the reefs, latter part employed in putting oil Down between Decks, at Noon Calm. Lat. 28-47 S. - Long. 110-20 East.

Saturday August 31st. Commences with light winds from the S.E. Steering to the S.E.W. by the wind, at 2 P.M. sent up the M. S. Gallant yard and shifted the Fore Sail, - at Sunset Double reefed the Pop-sails, at Daylight made all Sail latter part strong breezes Employed in Sail mending - Lat. 29-02 S. - Long. 109-50 E.

Sunday Sept. 1st. Commences with Strong breezes from the E.S.E. and overcast Steering to the Southward by the wind, at Sunset set Sea watches, at 3 P.M. took in the M. S. Gallantail Middle part equally attended with showers of rain at 2 Am. cleared off set the M. Popgallantail, latter part winds from E.S.E. Steering S.E. by S. so ends these 24 hours Lat. 31-21 S. - Long. by lum. 108-16 E.

Monday Sept. 2nd. All these 24 hours Strong Gales from N.W. and equally attended with showers of rain, at 5 P.M. took in the Laboard Boat, at 11 Am. spoke the Ship *Sir William Forbes* from London for Batavia so ends Lat. 33-27 S. - Long. 110-17 E.

Tuesday Sept. 3rd. All these 24 hours Strong Gales from the N.W. and equally Steering Steering S.E. by S. M. S. G. Sail set. Lat. 35-52 S. - Long. 112-30 E.

Wednesday Sept. 4th. Commences with Strong Gales from the N.W. S. W. Steering to the S.E. by E. at 4 Am. winds from S.W. took in the M. S. Gallantail at 9 So. lying under a close reefed main Pop-sail all the Boats on Deck, at 11 So. saw a large Spinn Whale so ends Lat. 37-02 - Long. 115-12 E.

Thursday Sept. 5th. Commences with strong Gales from the S.W. heading to the Southward under a close reefed M. Pop-sail, at 2 Am. set the Fore Sail and Fore Pop-sail Double reefed at 11 Am. set the main Popgallantail latter part winds from S.W. by W. Steering from S.E. to E.S.E. so ends these 24 hours Lat. 37-09 S. - Long 117-00 E.

Friday Sept. 6th. All these 24 hours light winds from S.W. to W. and fine at 3 P.M. saw a Dead Right Whale, at 6 Am. put the Staboard Boat. Steered S.E. by E. so ends the Day Lat. 37-34 S. - Long. 117-46 E.

Saturday Sept. 7th. First part light airs from the westward, Middle part Calm, at 3 Am. took a fine breeze from the N.E. & Steered E. S.E. latter part winds from N.E. and overcast. Lat. 37-57 S. - Long. 119-55 E.

Sunday Sept. 8th. All these 24 hours brisk winds from the N.E. & E. and overcast Steering E. S.E. all Sail set. Lat. 39-52 S. - Long. 122-26

Monday Sept. 9th. All these 24 hours light winds from N. to N.E. and overcast Steering to the E. by S. Latitude by obs. 39-05 S. - Long. 124-13

Tuesday Sept. 10th. All these 24 hours moderate winds from the E.S.E. and Cloudy Steering to the S.E. by the wind No. obs. Lat. by Rec. 39-43 S. - Long 125-19

Wednesday Sept. 11th. Commences with strong Gales from the E.S.E. and Cloudy Steering to the S.E. by the wind, at 8 P.M. took in the M. Popgallantail and Double reefed the Pop-sails, at 2 Am. took in the main Sail at 4 took in the Jib so ends with Strong Gales Lat. 41-11 S. - Long. 126-26 E.

Thursday Sept. 12th. Commences with strong Gales from the E.S.E. and Cloudy Steering to the S.E. by the wind under Double reefs, at 9 P.M. took in the Fore Pop-sail, at 4 P.M. set the Fore Pop-sail, at 9 Do. wore Ship, at 10 saw two Right Whales Lat. 41-55 S. - Long 127-16 by D. Rec. 127-07 by lum. -

Friday Sept. 13th. First strong Gales from N.E. by E. Steering to the Northward and by the wind under Double reefs at 3 Am. took the Ship latter part under Single reefs & main Popgallantail set, so ends strong winds from N.E. by E. and overcast. Lat. 41-47 S. - Long. 127-28 E.
