

Ship Triton of New Bedford Bound to

Saturday Sept. 14th. Commences with strong gales from the N.E. by N. and cloudy, steering to the Eastward by the wind at midnight Double reefed the Topsails, latter part winds from N. and rainy steering E. by N. so ends N.E. do.

Sunday Sept. 15th. Lat. 41-53 S. - Long. 130-19 E.

First part strong gales from N. by W. and rainy steering to the E. by N. under Double reef, latter part moderate winds from S.W. to W. and fine weather all sail set, so ends

Monday Sept. 16th. Lat. 41-42 S. - Long by Rec. 132-18 E. - by Lun. 133-00

All these 24 hours moderate winds from W. to S.W. and fine weather steering E. latter part sent up the P. Topgallant yard & V. & W.

Tuesday Sept. 17th. Lat. 41-37 S. - Long. 135-10 E.

First part calm, middle and latter part strong winds from N.E. E. to N. by W. and cloudy, steering E. by S. so ends the day.

Wednesday Sept. 18th. Lat. 41-57 S. - Long. 137-57 E.

Commences with strong gales from the N.E. W. and thick weather, at 6 P.M. single reefed the Topsails, at 10 Am. Double reefed, took in the Jib and M. Sail, at 11 close reefed the M. Topsail, latter part rainy steering from E. by S. to E. S. E. so ends

Thursday Sept. 19th. Lat. by Rec. 42-37 S. - Long. 141-40 E.

Commences with strong gales from the N.W. steering S. E. by S. at 5 P.M. headed to the W. S. W. under a close reefed M. Topsail and Spinnaker, attended with rain, at 9 P.M. the rain cleared off, and the winds hauled to the S.W. at 10 P.M. set the P. Sail and P. Topsail, and steered E. S. E. at 1 P.M. all sail set, at 2 P.M. steered E. latter part strong breezes from S.W. to N.W. attended with squalls of rain

Friday Sept. 20th. Lat. 43-35 S. - Long by Lun. 144-55 E. Long by D.R. 144-00

Commences with strong winds from the N.W. and rainy steering E. by S. at 1 P.M. single reefed the Topsails, at 4 P.M. made Van Dusen's land bearing S. by N. by Estimation 25 mi. Dis. at 6 took in the Jib and Main Sail, at 4 Double reefed the Topsails, steered E. S. E. at 9 hauled up the P. Sail middle part winds from S.W. attended with heavy rain, hauled to the Southward by the under Short Sail, at 6 Am. made all sail and steered N. E. by E. at Noon the light house on the W. side of Cape Cod Channel bore W. N. W. Cape Pillar N. E. by E. the nearest land on S. E. Cape N. N. W. 3 mi. Dis. - Lat. by obs 43-34 South. Winds from W. and pleasant.

Lord Howes Island 1899.

Saturday Sept. 21st. First part light winds from S. E. E. and pleasant steering on different tacks by the wind at 10 P.M. took strong equal from W. and Thunder attended with rain steered E. by S. latter part strong winds from W. to N. W. at 10 Am. Double reefed the Topsails steering on different courses from E. by N. to N. E. by N. - at midnight Cape Pillar bore N. N. W. 15 mi Dis.

Sunday Sept. 22nd. Lat. by obs. 42-39 S. - Long. by Rec. 149-45 E.

Commences with strong winds from the N.W. and rainy, steering to the N. N. E. at 3 P.M. the wind shifted to the S. S. W. at 4 P.M. hauled the Jib and Main Sail, at 5 Am. winds from W. N. W. made all sail so ends fine and pleasant.

Monday Sept. 23rd. Lat. 40-49 S. - Long. 151-34 East.

First and middle part light winds from W. N. W. to N. and pleasant latter part strong breezes steering on different tacks by the wind at Noon Double reefed the Topsails, took in the Jib and Main Sail. - Lat. 39-32 S. - Long 152-15 East.

Tuesday Sept. 24th. Commences with strong gales from the N. and overcast steering to the Westward by the wind, at 4 P.M. took in the Fore Topsail, at 6 close reefed the Main Topsail and move ship, at 8 P.M. took in the Fore Sail, at 9 Am. the wind began to haul to the Westward and moderate at 10 set the Fore Sail, and Fore Topsail Double reefed, latter part attended with rain so ends N.E. do.

Wednesday Sept. 25th. Lat. by D.R. 39-45 S. - Long. 153-12 East.

First part calm with some rain, at 2 Am. took a breeze from the W. S. W. made all sail and steered N. N. E. latter part clear & pleasant

Thursday Sept. 26th. Lat. 38-45 S. - Long. 150-52 East.

Commences with moderate winds from the W. S. W. and pleasant steering to the N. N. E. at 5 Am. put out the Mast Boat, at 6 Am. strong winds from the N. by W. at 10 took in the Topgallant sails, at 9 P.M. saw Spinnaker Whales, at Double reefed the Topsails, put out the labour boat, at 11 lowered the labour boat fastened, at 11 the S. got stove the whale spouting thick blood, at Noon took the whale to the ship, so ends strong winds and squally. Lat. 37-44 S. - Long 155-07 E.

Friday Sept. 27th. at 1 P.M. the wind shifted to the S. and blew a Gale, attended with rain, at 2 P.M. commenced cutting at 5 P.M.
