Friday Oct. 11th. First part light winds and variables, latter part winds from S. & at 6 Am. made the three Kings bore N. E. by E. at latter part equally attended with Showers of rain Employed in stowing down oil, at Noon the 3 Kings bore N. E. by E. by Compass 24 mi. Dis. Lat. by obs. 34=23 S. here we find we have been in a strong Easterly Current for several Days

Saturday Oct. 12th. First part, First winds from S. and equally at 5 P.M. finished stowing down oil, latter part light variable winds and fine weather Lat. 34=20 S. - - - Long. 171=30 E.

Sunday Oct. 13th. First part winds from N. N. E. and fair, all Sail set at 3 P.M. spoke the Ship Java of New-Bedford 4 1/2 months out sail. Capt. P. went aboard, at 7 returned again, Middle and latter part heading to the Eastward under a Double reefed Main Top sail, and Fore sail, with winds from the N. and rainy

Monday Oct. 14th. First and middle part Strong winds from the N. and rainy, Steering on Different tacks under easy Sail, at 6 Am. made all Sail, latter part winds from N. W. and pleasant at Noon the middle of the three Kings bore N. E. 1/2 E. 5 mi. Dis. Lat. by obs. 34=18 S.

Tuesday Oct. 15th. Commences with winds from N. W. and pleasant Steering on Different tacks by the wind, at 2 P.M. got a lunar obs. which made the Long. 172=10 E. the Kings bearing S. N. E. by Compass 5 mi. Dis. at Sunset Double reefed the Topsails, at 5 Am. made all Sail at 7 So. Steered N. E. by E. so ends moderate winds and Hazy -

Wednesday Oct. 16th. Commences with light winds from the N. W. and fine Steering S. N. E. Middle and latter part light airs from the Westward and calm Steering on Different Courses so ends these 24 hours variously employed about the Rigging. Lat. 33=41 S. - - - Long. 173=19 E.

 Lat. 34=15 S. - Long. by D. R. - Long. by Lun. 174=30 E.

Friday Oct. 18th. Commences with brisk winds from the N. and smoky Steering S. S. at sunset shortened Sail heading on different tacks through the night under a Double reefed M. Top sail and Fore sail at 5 Am. blew on to a strong Gale and rainy, Close reefed the M. Top sail, reefed the the Fore sail and set the Spruce heading off Showers at 6 So. took in the Waist Boat, at 10 more moderate warm ship strong winds and thick weather ends the Day.

Saturday Oct. 19th. Lat. 34=54 S. - - - Long. by D. R. 174=50 E. Long. by Lun. 175=04  
 Commences with Strong Gale from the N. W. Steering to the W. S. W. at 6 P.M. took in the Fore sail and Fore Top sail, and wore Ship, latter part Strong Gale from W. S. W. so ends

Sunday Oct. 20th. Lat. 34=29 S. - - - Long. 175=01 East.  
 Commences with heavy Gale from the Westward at 2 P.M. took in the main Top sail, at 6 So. set it again, at 5 Am. set the Fore sail, Jib, and Topsails Double reefed, latter part winds from S. by E. and pleasant so ends Steering to the Westward

Monday Oct. 21st. Lat. 33=45 S. - - - Long. 175=30 East.  
 Commences with brisk winds from the S. S. W. and smoky Steering to the Westward by the wind all Sail set at 2 P.M. tacked Ship, latter part Strong winds from W. at 5 Am. put out the Waist Boat, at 10 So. took in the Topgallantails so ends the Day

Tuesday Oct. 22nd. Lat. 35=00 S. - - - Long. 175=32 E. by Lun.  
 Commences with strong breezes from the W. and smoky Steering to the S. S. W. by the wind, at 2 P.M. made New Zealand having 2.00 by W. at Sunset the Fore Tights bore S. by W. 1/2 W. Cape Horn W. 1/2 S. latter part light winds so ends Steering on Different tacks at Noon Cape Horn bore W. 1/2 S. 15 mi. Dis.

Wednesday Oct. 23rd. Commences with Strong breezes from the W. Steering to the southward by the wind, at 6 P.M. Cape Horn bore S. W. 2 mi. Dis. tacked Ship. Middle and latter part winds from W. to S. S. W. Steering on Different tacks by the wind at Noon in the Entrance of Bay of Islands

Thursday Oct. 24th. Commences with Strong breezes from the S. S. W. heading into the Bay at 5 P.M. came to anchor in 8 fath. so ends the Day
