Tuesday Jan. 7th. Commences with strong Gales from the S. heading to the S. E. at 2 P.M. saw a Sail steering to the Northward at 4 Am. quite moderate set the Fore Sail and Single reefed Topsails and Steered S. E. & ends the Day Lat. 37-25 S. Long 158-50 E.

Wednesday Jan. 8th. First part winds from S. Steering S. E. & E. under Single reefed Topsails, at sunset shortened Sail, latter part light variable winds steering on Different Courses

Lat. 37-30 S. - - - Long. 158-56 E.

Thursday Jan. 9th. First part Strong breezes from the S. E. Steering S. E. & E. by the wind, Middle and latter part strong Gales from S. E. to S. W. attended with showers of rain heading to the S. E. under a close reefed M. Topsail and 2 Topsails stay sail

Lat. 37-16 S. - - - Long. 154-46 E.

Friday Jan. 10th. All these 24 hours strong Gales from S. and equally heading on Different tacks under a close reefed Main Topsail & c.

Lat. 36-50 S. - - - Long. 154-24 E.

Saturday Jan. 11th. First part moderate Gales from the S. heading to the S. E. under a close reefed Main Topsail latter part light variable winds and fine weather steering on Diff. Courses

Lat. 36-40 S. - - - Long. 154-36 S.

Sunday Jan. 12th. First part moderate winds from the S. E. Steering S. E. all Sail set, Middle part heading to the Eastward by the wind under a Double reefed Main Topsail and Fore Sail latter part strong Gales and Cloudy at 4 Am. set the Fore Topsail Double reefed, Jib and Mizzen so ends 24 hrs.

Monday Jan. 13th. Commences with strong Gales from the N. by E. and rainy steering to the E. under Double reefed Topsails, at 2 P.M. under a close reefed Main Topsail and Spruce, Middle and latter part moderate winds from N. to N. W. at 5 Am. set the Topsails Double reefed so ends rainy Lat. by Rec. 37-40 S. - Long 156-00 E.

Tuesday Jan. 14th. All these 24 hours winds from the N. E. and rainy steering to the Eastward by the wind under Double reefs lying under short Sail through the night No. obs.

Wednesday Jan. 15th. First and Middle part winds from S. E. & E. to S. E. and rainy, latter part fair weather all Sail set steering on Different Courses Lat. 38-39 S. - - - Long. 157-30 E.

Thursday Jan. 16th. First part winds from the S. E. and Cloudy, steering S. E. & E. by the wind all Sail set, at sunset shortened Sail, at Daylight set the Topsails Double reefed, at 4 Am. saw Sperm Whales appeared to be Gallied by the Ship, lowered 2 Boats at 40 So. returned to the Ship, Whales going quick to windward latter part strong Gales from S. E. steering on Different tacks by the wind Lat. 38-11 S. - - - Long. 158-56 E.

Friday Jan. 17th. Commences with strong Gales from the S. E. Steering to the Eastward by the wind under Double reefs, at 3 P.M. saw Sperm Whales and lowered 2 Boats, at 6 So. returned to the Ship without success, at sunset shortened Sail, latter part light winds and fine weather steering on Different tacks by the wind all Sail set

Lat. 38-09 S. - - - Long. 158-54 East.

Saturday Jan. 18th. All these 24 hours light winds from S. to S. W. and fine weather steering on Different Courses

Lat. 38-21 S. - - - Long. 159-20 E.

Sunday Jan. 19th. First part light winds from the W. steering to the S. E. latter part fresh breezes from N. W. steering on Different Courses, at 9 Am. saw Sperm Whales and lowered 3 Boats whales going quick to windward, at 4 P.M. the S. Boat fastened and the iron Dred so ends in pursuit of the Whales No. obs. Lat. by L. R. 37-41 S. - Long. 160-00 E.

Monday Jan. 20th. At 2 P.M. the Boats returned onboard without success, at 5 So. saw Sperm Whales and lowered 3 Boats the S. Boat fastened and line parted at 6 So. returned onboard and shortened Sail Middle and latter part strong Gales from N. W. heading on Different tacks by the wind under a close reefed M. Topsail, and Fore Sail, at 9 Am. saw Sperm Whales, to suggest to lower the Boats so ends the Day Lat. 37-40 S. - - - Long. 161-00 East.
