Feb. 6th. Commences with strong winds from the S. S. E. Steering S. by W. all sail set, at sunset shortened sail and headed to the Eastward, latter part moderate winds and pleasant Steering S. W. by S. all sail set employed in heading blacking topsail sheets &c. &c. Lat. 33-15 S. - Long. 150-20 E.

Friday  
Feb. 7th. All these 24 hours moderate winds from S. S. E. to S. W. and fine weather, steering on different tacks by the wind under way sail through the night, here we find a strong southern current. Lat. by obs. 33-16 S. - Long. 150-24 E.

Saturday  
Feb. 8th. All these 24 hours strong Gale from the S. W. and fair pleasant Steering on different tacks by the wind under short sail through the night lat. 33-34 S. - Long. 150-24 E.

Sunday  
Feb. 9th. First part winds from S. W. Steering to the S. W. by the wind latter part light winds and variable steering on different courses to the Southward saw a sail at noon lying with the M. topsail aback and the sail running down so ends fine & pleasant Lat. 33-36 S. - Long. 150-36 East

Monday  
Feb. 10th. At 1 P.M. Capt. Parker went aboard the Bark Caroline 18 mo. out 400 bbls. at 2 P.M. returned onboard light winds from S. W. to S. Steering on different tacks under easy sail through the night Lat. 33-11 S. - Long. 150-09 E.

Tuesday  
Feb. 11th. First and middle part strong breezes from S. to S. E. and fair, steering to the S. W. by the wind, at 6 P.M. took in the M. topgallant sail at 8 Am. wore ship at 9 So. set the M. S. G. sail, at 11 Steered S. W. by S. Lat. 32-18 S. - Long. 150-07 East.

Wednesday  
Feb. 12th. All these 24 hours moderate winds from the S. and fine weather steering S. W. by S. all sail set Lat. 33-26 S. - Long. 150-42 E.

Thursday  
Feb. 13th. Commences with winds from S. and fair steering S. W. by S. at 4 P.M. nearly Calm, at sunset Double reefed the topsails middle and latter part light winds from S. W. to S. E. steering on different tacks by the wind, at 1/2 past 11 Am. saw blackish and low wind without success. Lat. 34-25 - Long. 150-05 E.

Feb. 14th. First part Calm at 2 P.M. took a light breeze from the S. E. and Steered S. W. at Midnight strong breezes from S. W. attended with heavy rain, at took in the Main topgallant sail, Jib, Fore topsail, and Fore sail and clewed down the M. topsail, at Daylight the rain ceased of made all sail latter part strong breezes from W. S. W. to S. S. W. and thick weather steering to the S. E. by the wind, at 10 Am. Double reefed the topsails at 11 So. headed the Fore and Mizzen topsails so ends obs.

Saturday  
Feb. 15th. Commences with strong winds from the S heading to the Eastward by the wind, at 2 P.M. set the Fore topsail Double reefed and Jib at sunset took in the jib and Fore topsail, latter part under Double reefs, strong Gale ends the Day Lat. 35-00 S. - Long. 150-32 East.

Feb. 16th. Commences with strong winds from the S S E. Steering to the Eastward by the wind under Double reefs, at 6 P.M. wore ship, at 5 Am. made all sail latter winds from S. E. by E. and cloudy steering S. S. W. obs. Lat. by L. H. 35-47. Long. 150-06 E.

Feb. 17th. Commences with fresh breezes from the S. S. E. and fine weather steering S. S. W. all sail set, at 6 Am. Steered S. by W. so ends the Day. - Lat. by obs. 37-23 S. - Long. by Obs. 156-03 E.

Tuesday  
Feb. 18th. All these 24 hours <sup>winds</sup> fresh from S. to S. S. E. and fine weather steering on different courses, lying under short sail through the night. Lat. 37-18 S. - Long. 150-44 East.

Feb. 19th. All these 24 hours winds from S. E. and fair steering on different tacks by the wind lying under short sail through the night Lat. 37-32 S. - Long. 150-05 E.

Thursday  
Feb. 20th. First part winds from S. E. Steering to the Eastward by the wind, at sunset shortened sail, at Daylight made all sail, latter part strong winds from S. S. W. to W. and rainy at 11 Double reefed the topsails so ends steering S. S. E. obs. Lat. by L. H. 37-59. Long. - 150-20 E.

Feb. 21st. Commences with strong winds from the W. S. W. and rainy steering S. S. E. at 2 P.M. the wind shifted to the S. and blew a
