to the Eastward by the wind under a close reefed Main
Top sail and Fore Topmaststay sail Lat. 28-13 S. - Long 160-03

Saturday
March 7th All these 24 hours strong Gales from S.E. to E. by S.
heading to the Eastward by the wind, at 6 P.M. took
in the main Top sail and Fore Topmaststay sail and
set the Fore Spinner and Fore Stay sail so ends.

Sunday
March 8th All these 24 hours strong Gales from S.E. to E.S.E. heading
to the N.E. under the Spinner and Fore Stay sail
Lat. 27-58 S. - Long 159-58 E.

Monday
March 9th Commences with strong Gales from the S.E. by E. and
Cloudy, at 4 P.M. set the M.S. Sail close reefed and Fore
Topmaststay sail, and wore Ship, at 6 am. set the Fore
Sail, at 8 So. set the Fore Top sail Double reefed latter
part employed in fitting the cutting Block straps

Tuesday
March 10th Commences with strong Gales from the S.E. Steer-
ing to the Southward by the wind under Double
reefs, at sunset shortened Sail, at Daylight set the
Fore sail and Double reefed Top sails, latter part mod-
erate winds from and a heavy swell on employ-

a Double reefed Main Top sail and fore sail, at 5 am.
made all Sail, at 6 steered E. by N. at 7 strong Gales
from S.W. and equally, at 8 So. under a close reef-
ed main Top sail and Fore Sail so ends employed
in Sail mending Lat. 32-22 S. - Long 159-04 E.

Sunday
March 15th Commences with strong Gales from the S.W. Steering
to the E. by N. under a Double reefed M. Top sail and Fore
Sail, at sunset close reefed the M. Top sail, latter part
more moderate winds from S. at 5 am. made all Sail
so ends the Day Lat. 32-03 S. - Long 161-04 East.

Monday
March 16th Commences with moderate winds from S.E. Steering E. all
Sail set, at sunset Double reefed the Top sails, at Daylight
made all Sail, Middle and latter part winds from S.E. Steer-
ing S.E. by the wind. Lat. 31-40 S. - Long 162-04 E.

Tuesday
March 17th All these 24 hours moderate winds from the S.E.
to E.S.E. Steering on Different tacks by the wind employ-
ed in Sail mending unbenent the Main Top sail and bent
another 20. Lat. 32-33 S. - Long 162-34 East.

Wednesday

S.W. latter part squally Steering on Different
Courses to the Eastward Lat. 32-16 S. Long 163-53 E.
