

Ship Triton of New-Bedford Cruising

- Friday June 12th 1840. This Day winds from E. to E. S. E. and fair, Cruising in sight of Okeah employed in painting the Boats &c.
- Saturday June 13th. Fresh breezes from E. to S. E. and fair weather Cruising in sight of Okeah variously employed.
- Sunday June 14th. First and Middle part strong breezes from E. to E. S. E. and fine weather, latter part light winds at noon Okeah bearing E. by S. by Compass 18 mi. Dis. Lat. by obs. 17-10 S.
- Monday June 15th. This Day light winds from E. S. E. to E. S. E. and fair Steering on Different Courses to the Westward from N. W. to S. W. under all Sail by Day, and easy Sail through the night Tackmanua in sight, at 10 Am. made Round Island in sight bearing S. W. by S. at Noon Round Island bore S. S. W. 30 mi. Dis. Lat. by obs. 16-20 S. Long by Chrs. 177-56 E.
- Tuesday June 16th. light winds from N. E. to E. S. E. and fair Steering on Different courses to the Westward the Islands in sight Lat. by obs. 17-04 S. - Long. by Chrs. 177-01 E. Coconut Island Lat. 17-08 S. Long. 177-05 E.
- Wednesday June 17th. This Day winds from S. E. to N. E. and fair Cruising of Coconut Island, at Noon the Island bore E. S. E. 10 mi. Dis. Lat. by obs. 17-03 S.
- Thursday June 18th. light winds from E. S. E. to N. Steering on Different tacks by the wind a Sail in sight so ends employed in making Spungarn, at Noon Coconut Island bore E. by S. 14 mi. Dis.
- Friday June 19th. First part moderate winds from N. and fair at 2 P.M. spoke the Ship Hantucket of Hantucket 36 mi. out 1800 Sp. 400 W. oil Latter part brisk winds from W. to S. attended with showers of rain, at Noon Lat. by obs. 17-08 S. Coconut Island bearing E. 16 mi. Dis. so ends in E. with the Hantucket

of the Fee Jee Islands 1840.

- Saturday June 20th. All these 24 hours strong breezes from S. Steering on Different Courses in company with the Hantucket at Noon Lat. 17-06 S. the Islands in sight.
- Sunday June 21st. This Day brisk winds from S. to S. E. and fair, at 4 P.M. saw the Ship Hantucket's Coulers set, and Boats down. a long way to leeward at 8 Do. spoke her and found she had taken 4 Whales, so under Steering Different Different Courses, at Noon Coconut Island bore S. E. by S. 10 mi. Dis. Lat. by obs. 17-00 S. -
- Monday June 22nd. Brisk winds from the S. and fair Steering on Different Courses in Company with the Hantucket, at 1/2 past 10 Am. saw the Hantucket keep off before the wind, kept off after her, and supposing she saw Whales turned 3 Boats at 1/2 past 11 Do. came up with the Ship and found she had picked up a Dead Whale, Capt. P. went on board the Hantucket, and the other Boats returned on board the Triton, at Noon Coconut Island bore S. E. 8 mi. Dis.
- Tuesday June 23rd. Brisk winds from S. and equally Steering on Different Courses employed in making Spungarn at Noon Coconut Island bearing E. 14 mi. Dis.
- Wednesday June 24th. Brisk winds from S. to S. E. Steering on Different Courses in Company with the Hantucket at 3 P.M. Capt. Edwards came on board, at 8 Do. returned on board his Ship at Noon Coconut Island bore S. E. by S. 10 mi. Dis. Lat. 17-2 S.
- Thursday June 25th. All these 24 hours variable winds and overcast Steering on Different Courses in Company with the Hantucket at Noon the Islands in sight of Deck, bearing from S. E. to E. Hacks.
- Friday June 26th. Winds from the Southward and fair Steering on Different Courses, of the S.W. part of the group 4 Ships in Company, at Noon Coconut Island bore E. by S. 12 mi. Dis. Lat 17-00 S.
