

Ship Triton of N. Per Bedford Lying to Anchor

Thursday July 23<sup>rd</sup>. Moderate winds from S. E. and fair Steering on Different tacks by the wind all sail set first part employed in sail mending, latter part in breaking out the after hole  
 Lat. 15-58 S. Packanov in sight

Friday July 24<sup>th</sup>. All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward and fine weather Steering on Different tacks by the wind Packanov in sight Lat. 15-54 S.

Saturday July 25<sup>th</sup>. Light airs from S. E. and Calms, Steering to the E. by the wind, at Noon Okeah bore S. by E. 1/2 E. by Compass, Dis. 24 mi.  
 Lat. by obs. 15-53 S.

Sunday July 26<sup>th</sup>. First part Calm, latter part Steering on Different tacks winds from E. S. E. at 9 Am. saw several Canoes of Okeah, inside the reef, at Noon Okeah bore S. 1/2 W.  
 Lat. by obs. 15-53 S.

Monday July 27<sup>th</sup>. This Day light variable winds and Calms, Middle part light Showers of rain Steering on Different Courses at Noon Okeah bore S. E. Lat. by obs. 15-56 S.

Tuesday July 28<sup>th</sup>. First and Middle part light winds from the Eastward and Calms, with some rain, latter part a fine breeze from the W. S. W. and clear, saw Killers, so ends Steering on Different Courses, at Noon Okeah bore S. E. Lat. by obs. 15-57 South.

Wednesday July 29<sup>th</sup>. All these 24 hours light winds from S. S. W. and smoky, Steering on Different Courses, at Noon Okeah bore S. by W.  
 Lat. by obs. 16-02 South.

Thursday July 30<sup>th</sup>. Light winds from S. S. W. to S. E. and smoky Steering on Different tacks by the Wind, at Noon Okeah bore S. by W. 18 mi Dis. Lat. by obs 15-59 S.

Friday July 31<sup>st</sup>. First part Winds from S. E. to E. S. E. and equally Middle and latter part brisk winds from E. S. E. and fair Steering on Different Courses at Noon Okeah bore W. S. W. by Compass, Lat. by obs. 16-10 S.

at Pacanov, Mudwater Harbor 1840.

Saturday August 1<sup>st</sup>. This Day brisk winds from E. to S. E. and fair Steering on Different Courses, employed in setting up Shocks, at Noon, Okeah bore S. E. 1/2 miles Distance lowered a boat boarded a canoe and took a Native Pilot on board so ends the Day.

Sunday August 2<sup>nd</sup>. First part light variable winds from the Eastward at 2 P. M. Steered through the passage in the reef toward Packanov at times nearly Calm, towing the Ship with the boats, at other times making very short tacks by the wind at 7 P. M. let go the anchor in 15 fathoms, muddy bottom. at 8 Am. weighed anchor, at 11 P. M. came to anchor in Mudwater Harbor 12 fathoms muddy bottom, in Company with the U. S. Vincennes and Peacock Ships of War, so ends with light winds from the S. E.

Monday August 3<sup>rd</sup>. Civil account First part light Winds from the S. E. and fair employed in getting Water trading with the natives for vegetation &c. &c. one watch on liberty.

Tuesday August 4<sup>th</sup>. Strong Winds from S. E. and smoky, variously employed watch on liberty.

Wednesday August 5<sup>th</sup>. First part Strong Winds from S. E. at 7 P. M. let go another Anchor, employed in getting Water one Watch on liberty.

Thursday August 6<sup>th</sup>. light variable winds and equally employed in getting water one Watch on liberty.

Friday Aug. 7<sup>th</sup>. brisk winds from the S. E. and Calms, employed in taking Water and stowing of betwixt Decks one watch on liberty. Arrived the U. S. Brig Porpoise.

Saturday August 8<sup>th</sup>. Light variable winds and fine weather at 6 Am. unbent the Fore Topmast and bent another at 9 furnished the U. S. Squadron with 5 bbls. of beef and some Molasses, and then Discharged the Steward David Thomas for bad conduct, and put him on board the U. S. Peacock.
