

Ship Triton of New Bedford Bound

Wednesday Sept. 2nd. All these 24 hours strong Gales from S.W. by S. middle part squally, under single reefs, at 5 Am. split the Jib unbent it and bent another latter part all Sail set.
Lat. 20-11 S. - Long. 179-49 West.

Thursday Sept. 3rd. First and middle part strong winds from S. S. W. to S. Steering to the S. E. by the wind, at Daylight made two small Islands one bearing N. E. and the other S. E. and reefed out in North and South from the North Island 5 or 6 mi. S. with heavy breakers on it at 8 ticked Ship, latter part move moderate all Sail set and the wind hauling to the Eastward at Noon winds from E. S. E.

Friday Sept. 4th. Lat. by obs. 21-00 S. Long. by Chron. 179-10 W. First part light winds from E. Steering to the S. S. E. Middle and latter part light variable Winds and Calms with a heavy swell from the S. E. Lat. 21-23 S. Long 178-55 W.

Saturday Sept. 5th. First and middle part light variable winds and Calms Steering to the S. S. E. Latter part light air from S. W. sent down the cutting Buntards looked at them and sent them up again Lat. 21-48 S. Long. 179-12 W.

Sunday Sept. 6th. Commences with moderate Winds from the Westward and pleasant, Steering to the S. by E. at 2 Am. strong winds and squally, at 5 Do. took in the Fly Jib, and fore Poppard Sail, at 4 Do. the wind shifted to the S. at 6 Do. Double reefed the Popsails, latter part squally took in and made Sail several times and Steering to the S. S. E. by the Wind. Lat. 22-56 S. - Long 178-37 W.

Monday Sept. 7th. Commences with strong Winds from S. S. E. Steering to the E. by the wind, at 1 P.M. spoke the Bark Caroline of Sidney 17 mo. 600 bbls. the Capt. came onboard, at 2 Do. the Capt. went onboard, and Steered to the N. E. at Sunset Double reefed the Popsails, at 3 Am. winds from S. E. at 6 Do. wore Ship set the main Sail and let one reef out of the Popsails, latter part strong Gales from the E. S. E. and a heavy swell from the S. Lat. 22-49 S. - Long. by Chron. 177-58 W.

Tuesday Sept. 8th. Commences with strong Gales from E. S. E. Steering to the S. under single reefs, at Sunset Double reefed the Popsails, and took in the main Sail, at 8 P.M. hauled up the Fore Sail, at 10 Do. took in the Jib and Spanker at Midnight wore Ship, at 3 Am. wore again, at Daylight set the Courses, Jib, and Spanker, and turned the reefs out of the Popsails, at 11 Do. made the Breakers on Archbolds Shoal, bearing S. W. by W. at Noon the Breakers bore W. by S. for S. 10 mi. Dis.

Wednesday Sept. 9th. Lat. 23-43 S. - Long. by Chron. 178-35 West. Strong Gales from E. S. E. Steering to the Southward by the wind, at 4 P.M. breakers of the lee Beam, First part under Double reefs, latter part all Sail set. Lat. 25-19 S. - Long. 179-24 West.

Thursday Sept. 10th. Strong breezes from E. to E. N. E. and overcast Steering on different tacks by the wind, carrying all Sail through the long and double reefed Popsails through the night No. obs. Lat. by S. R. 25-54 S. - Long 179-20 W.

Friday Sept. 11th. All these 24 hours strong Gales from E. to N. E. Steering on different tacks by the Wind. latter part squally set up the main Topmast Backstays unbent the Miz. S. Sail &c.

Saturday Sept. 12th. Lat. 26-19 S. - Long. 178-48 W. First part strong winds from E. Steering to the S by the wind under whole Popsails, middle and latter part winds from E. by S. to S. E. and steady under Double reefs, so ends with strong Gales

Sunday Sept. 13th. Lat. 27-41 S. - Long. 178-04 West. Commences with strong Gales from the N. E. Steering to the E. S. E. by the wind under Double reefs, at Sunset took in the Jib and Spanker, at 9 P.M. took in the Fore Popsail, middle and latter part thick weather with small rain, at 6 Am. set the F. P. Sail Jib and Spanker, Lat. 28-27 S. - Long. 177-33 W.

Monday Sept. 14th. First part strong Gales from N. E. middle part variable Winds and squally, under short Sail latter part brisk winds from S. W. and pleasant Steering N. E. by N. Popsails set Lat. 28-15 S. - Long 176-30 W.
