Dec. 6th. Commences with heavy Gales from the S. by W. heading to the Westward, at 3 P.M. took in the W. Boat, and Main Topsail, at 5 P.M. turned up the S. Boat, latter part moderated some.
Lat. 35-55 S. - - - Long. 178-20 W.

Monday
Dec. 7th. First and Middle part strong Gales from S.W. to S heading to the Westward, at 6 Am. set the Fore Sail and Close reefed Main Topsail, latter part more moderate and pleasant, Lat. 36-12 S. - - - Long. 179-34 W.

Tuesday
Dec. 8th. Commences with brisk winds from the S. and a great swell on at 4 P.M. put out the Waist Boat and let one reef out of the Main Topsail, Middle part Calm, latter part light winds from S.W. and smoky Steering to the S. by the wind all Sail set
Lat. 35-38 S. - - - Long. 179-29 W.

Wednesday
Dec. 9th. First part Winds from S.W. Steering to the S. by the wind, at 4 P.M. set the Fore Topsail and all Sails, latter part winds from W. Steering S. by W. all Sail set
Lat. 33-47 S. - - - Long. 178-28 W.

Thursday
Dec. 10th. All these 24 hours moderate Winds from S.W. to W. S.W. and fine weather Steering to the Southward by the wind, latter part rigged out the Fly Gibbons
Lat. 32-25 S. - - - Long. 178-14 W.

Friday
Dec. 11th. This Day moderate winds from S.W. to S. and fine weather Steering on Different tacks by the wind,
Lat. 31-24 S. - - - Long. 178-20 W.

Saturday
Dec. 12th. At 1 P.M. made the French Rock bearing W. by S. and steered that way, at 4 P.M. spoke the Ship London Packet of Fair Haven 13 ms. out 500 bbls. at 7 P.M. spoke the Ship an English Bark 4 ms. from Sydney 500 bbls. at 7 Am. made Macaulay's Rocks bearing S.W. by S. at 9 P.M. saw Sperm Whales and lowered 3 Boats all the Boats fastened, at 11 Am. took 3 Whales to the Ship.

Sunday
Dec. 13th. At 1/2 past 1 P.M. commenced Cutting, at 8 P.M. finished at 7 Am. commenced boiling the London Packet in sight to London Cutting winds from the Eastward and fine weather, Lat. 30-43 S. Long. 179-18 W. Macaulay's Rocks in sight

Dec. 14th. Winds from E. and fine weather Steering on Different courses under easy Sail, employed in boiling at noon the French Rock in sight from Masthead bearing S. E. by Compass Lat. 31-05 S.

Tuesday
Dec. 15th. Strong winds from the Eastward Steering on Different tacks by the wind under easy Sail employed in boiling
Lat. 30-47 S. - - - Long. 179-26 W.

Wednesday
Dec. 16th. Commences with strong winds from the E. Steering to the Southward by the wind under Double reef, at 4 P.M. finished boiling, at Sunset shortened Sail and wore Ship, at Daylight set the Topsails Single reefed at noon Macaulay's Rocks bore S. by S. Goat Island S.W. by S.
Lat 30-26 S.

Thursday
Dec. 17th. Commences with brisk winds from E Steering to the Southward by the wind under Double reef, at 2 P.M. saw Sperm Whales and lowered all three Boats fastened, at 6 P.M. took 3 Whales to the Ship, at 5 Am. commenced Cutting, at 11 P.M. finished.

Friday
Dec. 18th. Commences with strong winds from E. heading to the S. at 2 P.M. set the Fore Sail and commenced boiling, at 4 P.M. wore Ship, at 6 P.M. saw Sperm Whales, at noon Goat Island bore S. E. so ends under a Close reefed Main Topsail and Fore Sail, Lat. 29-56 S. - -

Saturday
Dec. 19th. Strong winds from S. E. heading on Different tacks by the wind under a Close reefed Main Topsail and Fore Sail, at 3 Am. finished boiling, latter part employed in Steaming oil between Decks at noon Sunday Island bore S. E. Lat. by obs. 29-45 S.

Sunday
Dec. 20th. Strong breezes from the S. E. heading on Different tacks by the wind under easy Sail, first part employed in stowing down oil at noon Sunday Island bore S. E. by Compass 54 miles Distance, Goat I. bore S. E. by S. Lat. by obs. 29-41 S. -

Monday
Dec. 21st. This Day fresh breezes from the Eastward Steering on Different tacks by the wind, under easy Sail latter part employed in stowing down oil, at 7 Am. saw Sperm Whales near the Ship appeared to be killed saw no more of them, at noon Goat Island bore S. E. by S. Lat. by obs. 30-00 S.
