Canoe of with a few Oranges and Bananas, at Sunset took in the light Sails and hauled up the courses, at 7 am. lowered 3 Boats and took a small raft of Cask on shore latter part employed in Boating of Wood and a few Potatoes, Bananas, Oranges Pumpkins &c. fine weather ends the Day
