March 5th Wednesday All these 24 hours moderate winds from S. to W.S. W. Steering E. S. E. Middle part equally with thunder First and latter part fair
 Lat. 27-12 S. - Long. 148-32 W.
Thursday March 6th All these 24 hours moderate Winds from the Westward Steering E. S. E. fine weather
 Lat. 27-53 S. - Long. 147-00 W.
Friday March 7th First and Middle part moderate Winds from S. W. to W. S. W. and fair Steering E. by S. Latter part strong breezes from S. E. to E. and equally attended with heavy rain, at 8 Am. took in the light sails, at 11 Am. Double reefed the Topsails and took in the jib. No. obs. Lat. by S. 28-18 S. Long. 146-10 W.
Saturday March 8th First part strong Strong Gale from the S. E. and equally, latter part fair Steering to the Eastward by the wind under Double reefs at 6 Am. made Opavo Island bearing E. by S. at Noon the S. bore E.
 Lat. by obs. 27-39 S. Long. by Chron. 144-45 W.
Sunday March 9th Commences with strong Gale from the S. E. by E. and equally Steering to the Eastward by the wind, at under Double reefs, at 2 Am. wore Ship latter part Clear at Noon Opavo bore E. 18 mi. Dis. by estimation Lat. by obs. 27-28 S.
Monday March 10th All these 24 hours Strong Winds from S. E. and pleasant Steering on Different tacks by the wind under Double reefs, latter part employed in sail mending as ends at Noon Opavo bore S. by W. 20 miles Distance
 Lat. by obs. 27-16 S. - Long. by Chron. 144-26
Tuesday March 11th This day strong Winds from E. S. E. and fair Steering on Different tacks by the wind under single reefs, employed in repairing the Main Sail, at Noon Opavo bore S. by E. by estimation 16 mi. Dis. Lat. by obs. 27-22 S.
Wednesday March 12th First part strong Winds from E. and fair Steering on Different tacks by the wind under single reefs, at 5 P.M. Opavo bore S. E. 5 mi. Dis. 3 Natives came off in a Canoe, at 8 P.M. went onshore again latter part moderate Winds and equally all sail set, at Noon the Island bore S. S. E. 20 mi. Dis.

Bound to Opavo 1841

Thursday March 13th All these 24 hours light Winds from S. E. and fair Steering on Different tacks by the wind at Noon Opavo bore E. S. E. 5 mi. Dis. 2 Canoes came of 2 Natives in one and one in the other.
Friday March 14th First part calm, at 1 P.M. Capt. P went onshore on the S. W. part of Opavo at 8 P.M. returned again with a best load of Savan, a fine Watermellons, and Oranges, Middle part light winds from S. E. and equally, Steering E. S. E. Latter part strong Winds attended with showers of rain, at 7 Am. took in the main Topgallant sail, at 11 So. under Double reefed Fore and Main Topsails and Fore Sail at 1/2 past 11 wore Ship, at Noon Opavo bore S. W. by S. latter Lat. by obs. 27-17 S.
Saturday March 15th Commences with strong Gale from the S. E. and equally Steering to the S. E. W. by the wind, at 6 P.M. wore Ship Opavo bearing S. W. 8 mi. Dis. at 6 Am. set the Mizzen Topsail, Jib and Spanker Lat. by obs. 26-59 S. - Long. by Chron. 143-58 W.
Sunday March 16th Commences with strong Gale from E. S. E. and equally Steering to the S. E. by the wind under Double reefs, at 6 P.M. took in the Fore and Mizzen Topsails and Main Mast, at 6 Am. set the Fore and Mizzen Sails jib and Spanker, at 8 So. wore Ship, at 9 let one reef of the Topsails and set the Main Sail coasts Lat. 26-40 S. - Long. 143-37 West
Monday March 17th First and Middle part brisk Winds from E. S. E. and fair Steering to the S. by the Wind, latter part equally attended with showers of rain, at 6 Am. put out the W. boat, at 1 P.M. saw Green Whales near the ship lowered 3 Boats at 9 So. returned to the ship. Whales out of sight to windward at Noon Opavo in sight of Leek bearing S. W. by W. 4 ~~Green~~ Rocks, bearing E. S. E. Lat. by obs. 27-47 S. Long. 144-02 W.
Tuesday March 18th Commences with brisk Winds from S. E. equally Steering to the S. by the wind at 2 P.M. saw Green Whales and lowered 3 Boats the wheel boat fastened, at 3 So. the first Green Whales and the short ways parted the whale spouting thick blood, at 4 P.M. returned to the ship without success latter part moderate winds and fair at noon. saw Whales, at 11 So. lowered the
