

Ship Porton of Her. Bedford

Tuesday April 27th. All these 24 hours moderate Winds from S. E. and fine weather Steering on Different Courses to the Northward, variously employed Lat 18-57 S. - Long. 146-26 West.

Wednesday April 28th. All these 24 hours moderate Winds from S. E. and fine weather with light squalls of rain, Steering S. W. all Day and Night through the Day and Night and fore sail through the night Lat. 17-45 S. - - Long. 147-14 W.

Thursday April 29th. Commenced with moderate Winds from E. and fine weather Steering W. by S. at Sunset took in the light Sails and hauled up the fore sail, at Daylight made all sail, at noon made White bearing W. by S. at 1 P.M. saw four Whales and lowered 3 Boats, and all fastened at Noon 3 Whales raised and the Boats put again so ends Mites bearing S. E.

Friday April 30th. All these 24 hours light winds from the E. and fine weather at 6 A.M. 5 Whales alongside 3 to the Leeward Boat and 2 to the S. and W. Boats took one of the worst Boats Whales after raising him, at 6 A.M. commenced cutting at Noon finished Mites bearing S. E. by S. 30 mi. Dis. - -

Saturday May 1st. All these 24 hours light winds from S. E. to S. W. and fine weather employed in boiling at Noon Mites bore S. by W. 12 mi. Dis. - -

Sunday May 2nd. Light variable Winds and Calms at 3 P.M. fell in with the Leeward Boats Lance Whale took him alongside and cut him in, at 5 A.M. finished boiling at Noon Mites bore S. W. by W. 8 mi. Dis.

Monday May 3rd. First part Calm, Middle and latter part moderate Winds from S. E. to E. by S. Steering W. by S. at Noon the S. part of White bore W. the S. part S. W. by W. 1/2 W. Lat 18-47

Tuesday May 4th. First part Steering W. by S. Middle and latter part Steering on Different Courses light Winds from S. E. employed in stowing down oil, at Noon the S. part White bore S. W. 12 mi. Dis.

Lying to Anchor at Tahiti

Wednesday May 5th. All these 24 hours light Winds from S. E. and fine weather Steering on Different Courses, at 8 A.M. P. Varnes bore S. W. by S. 11 mi. Dis a Ship in sight behind Ennis and Tahiti

Thursday May 6th. All these 24 hours light Winds from S. E. to S. W. and fair, Steering on Different Courses, latter part employed in Cleaning Ship and bending Cables at Noon of Ponnoni Passage so ends waiting for a Plot, - -

Friday May 7th. Moderate Winds from S. E. at 3 P.M. took a Plot at 4 P.M. came to Anchor in Papeete Harbor 9 fathoms water,

Friday May 7th. Ev. acc. Brisk Winds from S. E. and fair employed in Cleaning the outside of the Ship, one watch on liberty

Saturday May 8th. This Day moderate Winds from S. E. took 2 and fair employed in Cleaning Ship &c. one watch on liberty arrived Ship Hunter - Lat 20 mi. out 200 lbs

Sunday May 9th. This Day strong Winds from the westward and fair one watch on liberty

Monday May 10th. Winds from S. E. to S. W. first part rainy latter part fair employed in painting one watch on liberty - -

Tuesday May 11th. Variable Winds and fresh breezes latter part had a heavy shower of rain, employed in Painting Ship &c. one watch on liberty, Arr. Ship St. Peter of Her. Bedford 23 mi. out 1500 lbs. 200 Sp. also Landing Bark Shepherds of Salem in this Port.

Wednesday May 12th. light Winds and variables Employed in Painting one watch on liberty
