June 30th. Commences with strong Gale from S.W. Steering S. E. at 7 P.M. took in the Topgallant sails, at 8 Do. Double reefed the Topsails, at 11 Do. let one reef out of the Topsails, at 7 Am. all Sail set latter part moderate winds from same fair —

Thursday July 1st. All these 24 hours winds from S. S. W. to W. S. W. Steering S. E. E. all Sail set variously employed latter part bent a heavy gale. — Lat. 32° 41' S. — Long. 119° 48' W.

Friday July 2nd. First and Middle part Strong Gale from W. S. W. to S. W. and Clear Steering S. E. by E. 1/2 E. latter part more moderate and Cloudy so ends variously employed about the Rigging Lat. 34° 53' S. — Long. 115° 19' W.

Saturday July 3rd. These 24 hours winds from W. S. W. to S. E. and thick weather Steering S. E. by E. 1/2 E. all Sail set latter part some rain S. E. obs. Lat. by obs. 36° 10' S. — Long. 113° 00' W.

Sunday July 4th. First part Winds from S. W. and Cloudy Steering S. E. by E. 1/2 E. Middle part rainy, latter part strong Gale from W. and equally Lat. by obs. 37° 26' S. — Long. 111° 33' W.

Monday July 5th. Commences with strong Gale from W. S. W. and equally Steering S. E. by E. 1/2 E. at 2 Am. Double reefed the Topsails at 4 Do. sent down the Fore Topgallant yard at 8 Am. let one reef out of the Topsails latter part moderate winds from S. W. and pleasant at 3 Do. all Sail set Lat. 38° 45' S. — Long. 108° 40'

Tuesday July 6th. First and Middle part light variable winds and fair, latter part strong Gale from S. E. and rainy took in the M. P. Gallant sail Double reefed the Topsails reefed the Main Sail parted the Jib sheet and nearly lost the Bonnet of the Jib. so ends S. E. obs.

Wednesday July 7th. First part strong Gale from S. E. to S. W. and rainy under Double reefs, Middle and latter part light winds from W. S. W. all Sail set at 10 Am. sent up the boom and set the S. P. Staysail Lat. 40° 48' S. — Long. 105° 40' W.

Thursday July 8th. First part moderate Winds from W. and fair latter part strong breezes from S. W. and equally steering S. E. by E. 1/2 E. employed in making Spinnaker Lat. 41° 56' S. — Long. 108° 16' W.

Friday July 9th. First and Middle part moderate from S. W. to W. S. W. and Cloudy latter winds from S. E. to S. E. Steering S. E. E. employed in mending Sails and making Spinnaker Lat. 43° 00' S. — Long. 101° 05' W.

Saturday July 10th. Commences with moderate winds from S. E. and Clear Steering S. E. at 4 P.M. strong breezes and rainy at 11 Do. Close reefed the Topsails, at 11 Do. Close reefed latter part light variable winds and Calms with steady rain made some Sail S. E. obs. Lat. 45° 22' S. Long. 99° 54'

Sunday July 11th. First and Middle part moderate winds from S. E. E. and rainy Steering to the Eastward by the wind, at 4 P.M. took in the Main P. G. Sail, at 5 Do. Close reefed the M. P. Sail latter part Strong Gale from S. E. to S. heading on Tippet ent took at 7 Am. under a Close reefed M. Topsail and S. P. Staysail Lat. by obs. 44° 00' S. — Long. 99° 58' W.

Monday July 12th. All these 24 hours heavy Gale from S. E. by S. heading to the Eastward by the wind under a Close reefed M. P. Sail and stormy Sails Lat. 45° 40' S. — Long. 99° 50' W.

Tuesday July 13th. First part strong Gale from S. E. heading to the Eastward under short Sail latter part winds from S. E. by E. 1/2 E. and pleasant Steering S. E. by E. 1/2 E. at 10 Am. let one reef out of the Main Topsail and set the Fore Topsail, at 11 Do. all Sail set Lat. 43° 47' S. — Long. 99° 14' W.

Wednesday July 14th. First part light variable winds and Cloudy with some rain Steering S. E. by E. 1/2 E. at Midnight strong Gale from S. E. Double reefed the Topsails at 4 Am. under a Close reefed Main Topsail and Fore Topsail staysail at 7 Do. winds from S. W. set the S. P. Sail at 9 Do. all Sail set latter part strong Gale from W. S. W. at 11 Double reefed the Topsails Lat. 44° 48' S. — Long. 99° 12'
