

Ship Triton of Herr Bedford

Monday August 17th Commenced with winds from N. by E. and thick weather attended with Thunder and rain, steering to the Westward by the wind, at 2 P.M. Double reefed the Topsails, at 8 Do. the wind shifted to the S. Steered N. at 8 Do. Close reefed the Topsails, at 2 Am. let one reef out of the Main Toppail, latter part moderate winds and pleasant at 6 Am. set the Topgallantails, at 10 Do. set Stiding sails, Lat. by obs. 12-22 S. - Long. by Obs. 44-13 W.

Tuesday August 18th First and Middle part light winds from S. to S. E. and fine weather steering N. 1/2 W. latter part light winds from S. E. to E. S. E. and thick weather and equally at noon took in the Topgallantails N. obs. Lat. by S. R. 31-10 S. - Long. 44-12 W.

Wednesday August 19th This Day brisk winds from N. E. and equally steering to the N. by the wind, took in and made Sail several times at 11 Am. sent a Boat to the Canova Capt. Sanders came on board Lat. by obs. 29-38 S. - Long 44-48 S.

Thursday August 20th First part brisk winds from N. N. E. and smoky steering on different tacks by the wind, latter part winds from W. S. W. steering N. by E. 20 ends employed in Sail mending Lat. 28-48 S. - Long. 45-04 W.

Friday August 21st This Day moderate winds from W. S. W. to S. W. and fine weather steering N. N. E. employed in Sail mending and shifting Sails Lat. 27-03 S. - Long. 43-40 W.

Saturday August 22nd This Day light winds from S. W. to S. S. E. and fair steering from N. to N. N. E. employed in mending Sails and shifting them Lat. 25-54 S. - Long 43-34 W.

Sunday August 23rd This Day light winds from N. E. to N. steering to the N. W. by the wind, got 3 bbls. of Flour from the Canova Lat. 25-17 S. - Long. 44-21 W.

Monday August 24th Commenced with brisk winds from S. S. W. steering N. N. E. all Sail set, at 2 P.M. saw a School of Whales lowered 3 Boats the Canova gallied them, at 4 returned without success, the Canova kept on for Rio Janeiro at 5 Do. out of sight of us at 8 Do. strong Gale

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Double reefed the Topsails took in the Jib, and Main Sail, Middle and latter part steering on different Courses from N. E. to S. N. E. at 6 Am. set the Main Sail and under the Miz. Toppail to repair Lat. 24-12 S. - Long. 43-14 W.

Tuesday August 24th This Day winds from S. W. to S. and smoky steering on different Courses to the Eastward at 6 Am. made Cape Gris bearing N. at 8 Am. the Cape bore N. W. by estimation 25 mi. Dis. Lat. by obs. 23-19

Wednesday August 25th All these 24 hours light winds from S. E. to N. N. E. and fair steering on different tacks by the wind saw several Sail Lat. 22-41 S. - Long. 40-58 W.

Thursday August 26th Commenced with brisk winds from N. E. steering to the S. E. by the wind at 7 P.M. took in the Topgallantails, at 2 Am. Double reefed the Topsails Lat. 20-25 S. - Long. 38-41 W.

Friday August 27th All these 24 hours strong breezes from N. E. to N. N. E. and Clear steering to the Eastward by the wind employed in Sail mending Lat. by obs. 20-35 S. - Long ³⁷⁻³⁰ 37-30 West.

Saturday August 28th First part strong breezes from N. steering to the Eastward by the wind, latter part light winds from N. W. all Sail set variously employed about the Riggin Lat. 23-11 S. - Long 36-23 W.

Sunday August 29th First part Calm, Middle part light winds from S. E. steering N. N. E. latter part light winds from N. N. E. steering to the N. W. by the wind Lat. 22-21 S. - Long. 36-43 W.

Monday August 30th This Day light winds from N. E. to N. by E. and fair steering to the N. W. by the wind, Lat. 21-41 S. - Long. 37-38 West.

Tuesday August 31st First part light winds from N. E. and fair steering to the N. W. by the wind, latter part strong breezes from N. and equally with some rain, they come on Lulls Lat. 20-30 S. - Long. 37-58 W.

Wednesday Sept. 1st This Day brisk winds from E. steering N. N. E. by the wind, latter part equally with showers of rain Lat. 19-07 S. - Long. 37-51 W.
