Friday July 14th 1865
Strong winds from S.W. at 10 A.M.
working to the N.E. through the day
and lying by the wind through the night
Lat by Obs 40° 42' 00"
Long by Chron 39° 47' 00"

Saturday July 15th 1865
These 24 fine breeze from N.W.
working to the N.E. through the day
and lying by the wind through the
night - see ends Lat by Obs 41° 04'
Long by Chron 40° 10'

Sunday July 16th 1865
Fresh breeze from W working to the N.E.
through the day and lying by the
wind through the night
Lat by Obs 41° 34'
Long by Chron 38° 23'

Monday July 17th 1865
Fresh breeze from W at 10 A.M. boarded
an English Bark bound to N.Y. sent
letters by her at night - took in
sail Lat by Obs 42° 48'
Long by Chron 37° 43'

Tuesday July 18th 1865
Fine breeze from N.W. steering
N.E. under short sail through the
night - weather thick
No day

Wednesday July 19th 1865
Fresh breeze from N.W. steering E.N.E.
under easy sail weather thick &
foggy Lat by Obs 44° 18'
Long by Chron 33° 20'

Thursday July 20th 1865
Moderate breeze from N.W. steering
E.S.E. under short sail - thick weather
at night took in sail latter thick
steering S.E. No day

Friday July 21st
thick weather steering S.E. at night
took in sail & lapped to the wind
latter steering E.S.E. thick weather
No day

Saturday July 22nd 1865
Beginning with thick weather steering
E.S.E. middle & latter lying by the
wind under short sail

Sunday July 23rd 1865
Light breeze from N.W. lying by the wind latter
steering N.E. at 11 P.M. spoke the Bark
Wave of New Bedford Capt Handy &
90 miles out clear Lat by Obs 44° 31'
Long by Chron 29° 15'

Monday July 24th 1865
First part strong winds from N.W.
heading to the N.W. Wave in ex at night
took in sail latter good weather
steering N.W. under all sail
Lat by Obs 45° 13'
Long by Chron 29° 45'
