

Remarks On Board Barque

Tuesday July 25th 1865
Commenced with strong winds from S.W.
steering N.E. under all sail at night
double reefed the topsails Middle took
in the Foresail weather rainy latter
took in the Foretopsail and close reefed
the main moderate gales from N.W.
heading N.W. weather thick & rainy
No sky

Wednesday July 26th 1865
Commenced with moderate gales
from N.W. bying two heading N.W.
Middle more moderate latter
under all sail Lat by Ob 47.42
Long by Chro 29.30

Thursday July 27th 1865
Moderate breezes from N.E. heading
to the E.S.E. at 8 P.M. Capt Cornell
lost some trouble with the coock
about coocking but did not strike
him he then got crazy mad and
the Capt had him put in irons
for the night No sky

Friday July 28th
Light variable winds heading
saw black fish bored without
success so ended Lat by Ob 46.89
Long by Chro 27.43

Vision Of New Bedford Capt Cornell

Saturday July 29th 1865
Fine weather and fine breeze from
N.E. cruising saw plenty of
Finbacks so ended this day Lat by Ob 46.00
Long by Chro 27.30

Sunday July 30th 1865
All these 24 hours fine weather &
fine breeze from N.E. cruising saw
three sails Lat by Ob 45.51
Long by Chro 27.17

Monday July 31st 1865
Fine breeze from N.E. on diff tack
by the wind saw several sail
Lat by Ob 45.56
Long by Chro 27.42

Tuesday Aug 1st 1865
Fine weather wind N.E. on diff
tacks saw several sail
Lat by Ob 46.04
Long by Chro 27.07

Wednesday Aug 2nd 1865
Light breeze from N.E. working to the
E. sett at the Main rigging
Lat 46.30.55
Long 27.33.00
