Remarks On Board Bark Tribon

Tuesday July 21st 1868
At 11 A.M. took our anchor with a
light air from S and commenced to
work out of the bay so ends this day

Wednesday July 22nd
Began with light air from S to S.W.
working out of N.B. under all sail
at 4 P.M. the pilot left Middle port
thick & rainier latter fine breeze from
S.W. heading S.E. employed in felling
boats so ends under all sail

Lat 40° 54' N
Long 70° 43' W

Thursday July 23rd
First part light breeze from S.W. to S.E. heading
to the S.E. by the wind Middle light air heading
S.E. latter calm and a thick fog No Ob.

Lat by G. R. 40° 28' N
Long " " 70° 24' W

First part fine breeze from E.N.E.
shifting S.E. by S thick weather employed in
coiling lines for the boats also got up the
cutting pendant Middle light breeze
latter fine weather heading S.E. saw
two sails

Lat by G. R. 39° 18' N
Long " " 68° 17' W

Saturday July 25th
First part calm Middle " " " " " "
the same latter fresh gale from
S.W. lying under close reefed
M. Topsail heaving S.E. No Ob.
