Tuesday Sept 22nd
Commence with fine breeze from
W.S.W. steering E.S.E. under all sail
Middle under short sail latter part
fresh breeze from N heading E.N.E.
Lat 37° 52' N
Long 33° 53' W

Wednesday Sept 23rd
These 24 hours strong breeze from the
N.E. heading to the E.S.E. Lat 37° 52'
Long 32° 40' W

Thursday Sept 24th
Commence with strong breeze from N heading
E.S.E. at night shortened sail latter part
E heading N.E. laid for blackfish the
S boat got captured Lat 37° 53' N
Long 32° 15' West

Friday Sept 25th
First part fine breeze from E heading N.W.
Middle part calm latter light breeze
from N heading to the E.N.E. under all
sail so steady these 24 hours
Lat 38° 22' North
Long 31° 55' West

Saturday Sept 26th
This day begins with strong breeze from
N.E. heading E.S.E. Middle heading N.W.
latter heading E. Flores bearing A by N
40 miles dis 2 sails in sight Lat 38° 10' N
Long 30° 55' W

Sunday Sept 27th 1858
Commence with strong breeze from N heading
to the E at night shortened sail latter
strong winds from N.W. under short sail
heading to the W.S.W. Lat 38° 49' N
Long 29° 40' W

Monday Sept 28th
First part strong breeze from N.W. W
steering to the E.S.E. under double reefes
at 4 P.M. made Fayal bearing E Dist
15 miles Middle on different tack latter
crucising off the West end of Fayal
Shake the schooner Mary B. Curran of
Provincetown Capt Fisher 4 months out 80 days

Tuesday Sept 29th
All these 24 hours strong winds from
N crucising off the west end of Fayal
employed in setting up shrouds for
water at noon Fayal E.S.E. dis 8 miles

Wednesday Sept 30th
These 24 hours strong winds from N
under double reefes latter steering in for
Fayal harbor

Thursday Oct 1st
Lying off and on St. Leger

Friday Oct 2nd
These 24 hours light air & calms
between Graciosa and St. George

Saturday Oct 3rd
Light breeze from S.E. between Graciosa
and Terceira
