Sunday Nov 1st
Commenced with fine breeze from S heading to the W. S. W. by the wind. Middle tacked to the S. E. later heading to the W. S. W. saw one sail Lat 22° 56' N Long 22° 56' W

Monday Nov 2nd
These 24 hours fine breeze from S heading to the W. S. W. under all sail Lat 23° 57' N Long 24° 30' W

Tuesday Nov 3rd
All these 24 hours fine breeze from S by E heading S. W. by W. under all sail employed in painting boats & C Lat 1° 37' N Long 26° 40' W

Wednesday Nov 4th

Commenced with light breeze from S heading S. W. by W. Middle the same at 1 P. M. felt the shock of A Submarine Volcano lasted about 30 seconds and caused the ship to tremble like A leaf latter fine heading S. W. employed in painting boats Lat 1° 37' N Long 27° 24' W

Thursday Nov 5th
These 24 hours fine breeze from S. E. to S. E. by S heading S. S. W. and S. W. by S under all sail saw blackfish Lat 1° 37' N Long 27° 33' W Bay Line 28° 20' W

Friday Nov 6th 1868
These 24 hours fine breeze from S. E. heading S. S. W. under all sail Lat 2° 44' S Long 28° 13' W

Saturday Nov 7th
Fine breeze from S. E. heading to the S. W. by S. under all sail Lat 4° 36' S Long 29° 17' W

Sunday Nov 8th
Fresh breeze from S. E. steering S. W. by S. under all sail Lat 6° 49' S Long 30° 35' W

Monday Nov 9th
These 24 hours fine trades from S. E. steering S. W. by S under all sail passed A whaler boiling heading to the N. E. Lat 9° 37' S Long 31° 50' W

Tuesday Nov 10th
All these 24 hours fine trades from S. E. heading S. W. by S under all sail Lat 12° 20' S Long 32° 50' W

Wednesday Nov 11th
Fresh trades from S. E. steering S. W. by S under all sail Lat 15° 02' S Long 34° 04' W

Thursday Nov 12th
First part fine breeze from S. E. steering S. S. W. latter moderate breeze from S. E. E. set the studding sail Lat 17° 07' S Long 34° 59' W
