

Remarks On Board Barge

Tuesday Jan 5th 1869
These 24 hours fresh breeze from E on different tacks saw several sail steering to the S.W sent down the main sail and repaired it

Lat 31° 24' S
Long 45° 32' W

Wednesday Jan 6th
Moderate breeze from N.E on different tacks saw cut squid porpoises & grampuses

Lat 31° 45' South
Long 45° 20' West
By Lunar 45° 10' "

Thursday Jan 7th
First and Middle part fine breeze from A on different tacks latter strong breeze

Lat 31° 42'
Long 45° 00'

Friday Jan 8th
All these 24 hours heading to the E wind A nothing in sight

Lat 31° 30'
Long 45° 50'

Saturday Jan 9th
First part light breeze from N.E spoke the Barge Edward Everett Capt Silva 19 months out 5000 nothing South this season

Lat 31° 40'
Long 44° 20'

Sunday Jan 10
First part moderate breeze from N sold the Edward Everett one cask of bread and one of flour 3 1/2 bbls Middle under short sail latter under all sail steering S.W

Lat 32° 04'
Long 45° 05'

Monday Jan 11th 1869
First part fine weather steering to the W spoke the Everett latter moderate breeze from E steering to the S Lat

Tuesday Jan 12th
Commenced with fine breeze from E steering S.S.W at night shortened sail Middle heading to the S.E latter steering S.W saw grampuses

Lat 33° 25' S
Long 46° 30' W

Wednesday Jan 13th
These 24 hours light air from N.W working to the W.S.W some foggy saw grampuses

Lat 33° 53'
Long 47° 12'

Thursday Jan 14th
Commenced with light air from W and a thick fog lying with the main yard aback latter the same wind from N.W to N

Friday Jan 15th
Commenced with fine breeze from N.W heading to the W.S.W saw cut squid Middle & latter foggy

Lat 34° 29' Long 48° 20'

Saturday Jan 16
Began with fine breeze from N.W.E heading W.N.W under all sail at night took in the light sails Middle blowing fresh double reefed latter dead calm at 9 A.M saw 8 whales going quick S.W lost the boats but could not get on to the whales
