

# Remarks On Board Barge

Master of New Bedford M. L. Snell Master

Saturday March 6th 1869  
Commenced with strong winds from N.E. heading to the E.S.E. under double reefed sail at night took in all but close reefed main topsail & storm sails Middle fresh gale, latter strong gale & rainy  
No Ob.

Sunday March 7th  
Commenced with heavy gales from N.E. attended with thunder and lightning Middle Moderate latter part calm  
Lat 34.04 S  
Long 47.00 W

Monday March 8th  
Commenced with calm at 3:50 M light breeze from S.W. made all sail and steered E. at night shortened sail Middle going with the main yard aback latter strong winds from S heading to the under short sail employed in repairing the cutting stage saw two sails Lat 33.42 S  
Long 46.20 W

Tuesday March 9th  
Commenced with strong breeze from S heading E.S.E. under double reefed Middle & latter Moderate on Duff tack saw nothing but three sails  
Lat 33.34 S  
Long 45.34 W

Wednesday March 10th  
First of Middle part light air & calm latter fine breeze from N.E. steering from N.W. to W. N.W. under all sail saw 4 minutes of Grampus  
Lat 33.42 N  
Long 46.25 W

Thursday March 11th 1869  
Three 24 hours began with fresh breeze from N.W. steering various courses at night took in sail and headed to the E. latter part strong winds from N and thick weather steering to the W under double reefed  
Lat 33.55 South  
Long 46.40 W

Friday March 12th  
This day began with strong breeze from S.W. steering E.S.E. under double reefed at night took in the E. topsail and luffed to the wind heading W latter more Moderate so ended under all sail heading W saw  
Lat 33.26 South  
Long 46.50 West

Saturday March 13th  
Commenced with fine weather and Moderate breeze from S steering to the W under all sail at night shortened sail Middle on Duff tack latter fine weather and fine breeze from E. heading to S.E. under all sail saw nothing but Grampus I begin to think I shall never see a sperm whale again  
Lat 33.41 South  
Long 47.02 West

Sunday March 14th  
Began with fine pleasant weather and fine breeze from E.S.E. heading S.E. at night shortened sail & tacked ship to the N latter fresh breeze from N.E. and soon raining heading to the N.W. under easy sail  
Lat 33.21 South  
Long 47.30 West
