

Remarks On Board Bogue

Tuesday May 25th 1869

First part calm Middle fine breeze from N.W. steering E latter strong breeze steering E by S under all sail Lat 29.56 South Long 31.00 West

Wednesday May 26th

All these 24 hours strong breeze from N.W. steering E by S under all sail Lat 30.00 South Long 26.36 West

Thursday May 27th

These 24 hours strong breeze from N.W. steering E.S.E under topsail & courses Lat 30.15 South Long 23.10 West

Friday May 28th

Commenced with fresh breeze from N.W. steering E.S.E Middle wind hauled to the W latter strong breeze from S.W. and some squally heading E Lat 30.15 S Long 20.10 W

Saturday May 29th

Begins with strong winds from S.W. steering E took in the light sails Middle squally wind from S.E. to E.S.E heading on the S track by the wind latter more moderate saw 3 sails Lat by DR 29.36 S Long by DR 18.50 W

Sunday May 30th

First part strong breeze from S.E. heading E.S.E Middle light variable airs and calms latter light breeze from E.S.E heading S.E under all sail so ends this day Lat 28.48 S Long 17.40 W

Monday May 31st

Commenced with fine breeze from N steering E.S.E under all sail Middle some squally wind from N.W. latter strong E.S.E under all sail Lat 27.06 S Long 14.30 W

Tuesday June 1st 1869

These 24 hours, begins with fresh breeze from N.W. steering E.S.E under all sail Middle fresh gales double reefed latter much the same under all prudent sail Lat 39.35 South Long 11.00 West

Wednesday June 2nd

Commenced with strong winds from N.W. steering E.S.E under all prudent sail Middle moderating latter light breeze from S heading E.S.E Lat 39.50 South Long 8.35 West

Thursday June 3rd

First & Middle part light variable airs and calms repaired the foretop sail latter fine breeze from N.E heading E.S.E under all sail saw a humpback Lat 30.00 S Long 8.00 W

Friday June 4th

This day begins with strong winds from N steering E.S.E under all sail Middle much the same latter fresh gales from N.W. steering E.S.E with the light sails in Lat 30.14 South Long 4.15 West

Saturday June 5th

Commenced with strong gales from N.W. steering S.E by E under double reef at 7 P.M. luffed to the wind heading N.E under close reefed maintop sail at 1 P.M. steered E.N.E fresh gales from W.S.W. latter more moderate under all sail steering E.N.E Lat 29.28 S Long 1.58 W

Sunday June 6th

All these 24 hours fresh breeze from S.E. to E.S.E heading from E.N.E to N.E under all prudent sail Lat 27.08 S Long 1.08 W
