

Remarks On Board Barque

Tuesday July 6th 1869

Commenced with fine weather
At anchor at 6 P.M. got underway and
steered down along the land at noon laid
for a humpback at night came to anchor
in 17 fathoms 6 miles from the land
At Noon Lat 5° 19' South
Long 114° 50' East

Wednesday July 7th

Commenced fine weather and
light airs from S.W. at 6 A.M. took the anchor
and steered down the coast at night came
to anchor Black Point bearing E. dist 3 miles
laid for humpbacks without success

Thursday July 8th

Fine weather at 6 A.M. took the
anchor and steered down along the land
at noon off Louisa at night came to anchor
in 10 fathoms 6 miles from the land

Friday July 9th Fine weather at 6 A.M. took
the anchor and steered down along the
coast light airs & calms Lat 4° 55' S

Saturday July 10th

All three 24 hours light airs
from S.W. steering down the coast laid for
humpbacks without success Lat 3° 50' S

Sunday July 11th

Fine weather and light breeze
from S.W. steering down the coast laid for
humpbacks and the S. boat started at two
but the iron came right out Lat 3° 13'
Long 10° 15'

Monday July 12th 1869

Three 24 hours fine breeze from
S.W. steering from N.W. under all
sail so ends No 8th

Tuesday July 13th

Three 24 hours fresh breeze from
S steering N under all sail
Lat 00° 00'
Long 8° 00'

Wednesday July 14th

Fine weather & fresh breeze from
South at daylight made Princes island
at noon came to anchor on the lee side
in 10 fathoms the Schooner Adm. Blake
of Marion at anchor here at 2 P.M.
laid for a humpback

Thursday July 15th

Fresh breeze from S.W. at
anchor at daylight laid the boats &
went round the island saw nothing

Friday July 16th

Fresh breeze three boats off cruising
the S. boat on board repairing at night
came on board

Saturday July 17th

Boats off cruising for humpbacks
saw one

Sunday July 18th

Boats off cruising for whales
at night came on board

Monday July 19th

Boats off cruising at night
came on board
