Thursday Oct 7th 1869
 Clear 24 hours, fresh breeze
 from S.E. steering S.W. under all sail
 Off 13.40
 Long 3.13.30

Friday Oct 8th
 Clear 24 hours, fresh breeze from
 S.E. heading S.W. under all sail at noon
 made the island of St. Helena bearing per
 compass W. S.W. dist 38 miles

Saturday Oct 9th
 Fine breeze steering in for
 the land at night shortened
 sail middle on stiff went back
 latter steering for James town at 9 A.M.
 came to anchor in 20 fathoms of water

Sunday Oct 10th
 Fine weather at anchor

Monday Oct 11th
 Fine weather employed in
 washing ship Charles Webb & Paul Berk
 on shore in the Hospital

Tuesday Oct 12th
 Fine painting ship Wm Robeson
 deserted

Wednesday Oct 13th
 Fine S. watch on liberty the other
 watch employed in painting Wm Robeson
 is on board again

Thursday Oct 14th
 Fine weather one watch on
 liberty one employed in painting ship

Friday Oct 15th 1869
 Fine weather at anchor one watch
 on liberty one watch painting

Saturday Oct 16th
 Fine one watch on liberty the other
 Wagon & Chas Egan deserted

Sunday Oct 17th
 Fine one watch on liberty
 the deserters no seen yet

Monday Oct 18th
 Fine one watch on liberty
 Charles Egan returned

Tuesday Oct 19th
 Fine weather at anchor shipping
 crew

Wednesday Oct 20th
 Fine weather at anchor shipping
 men so ended and getting ready for sea

Thursday Oct 21st Sea Breeze
 Commenced with fine breeze
 from S.E. at 4 P.M. got under weigh
 Middle lying off and on shipped on once
 again

Friday Oct 22nd
 Commenced with strong winds
 from S.E. at 2 P.M. all on board steering
 S.W. by the wind under double reef
 Lat By 8.11 17.00
 Long " 6.15.30
