

Remarks On Board Barque

Thursday Jan 6th 1870

Fine weather cruising under all sail saw four whales  
Lat 34° 18' S  
Long 6° 48' W

Friday Jan 7th

Fine weather cruising under all sail & sail in sight spoke schooner Washington Freeman of Fairhaven Capt Bralley 14 months out 120 sp 400 whale  
Lat 33° 49' S  
Long 5° 30' W

Saturday Jan 8th

Fresh breeze from W to S saw six sail  
Lat 34° 37' S  
Long 5° 40' W

Sunday Jan 9th

Fine weather spoke Brig G. W. Moore of Boston several sail in sight  
Lat 34° 54' S  
Long By 6° 00' W  
By 6° 50' W

Monday Jan 10th

Fine weather steering various courses saw nothing but whales  
Lat 34° 27' S  
Long 7° 00' W

Tuesday Jan 11th

Fine weather and fine breeze from W on different tacks by the wind spoke the Ospray at night  
Lat 33° 54' S  
Long 7° 00' W

Wednesday Jan 12

Fine weather and fresh breeze from N.W. spoke the Bark Crown Shield and Brig Abbot Lawrence of Fairhaven  
Lat 34° 30' S  
Long 7° 35' W

Tribon Of New Bedford M. L. Small Master

Thursday Jan 13th 1870

Fine weather cruising boarded the English Ship Oxford of London Capt Vaux 40 days from the Downs for Bombay  
Lat 34° 45' S  
Long 7° 40' W

Friday Jan 14th

First and middle part fine breeze from N heading W. N. W latter equally double reefed the topsails one sail in sight  
Lat By 34° 15' S  
Long " " 8° 30' W

Saturday Jan 15th

Commenced with strong breeze from N heading to the E. N. E under double reefed middle on different tack latter strong winds from W under double reefed saw two whales and three merchantmen  
Lat 34° 18' S  
Long 8° 18' W

Sunday Jan 16th

Thru 24 hours light air and calm a sail in sight whaler boarded German bark  
Lat 34° 00' S  
Long 8° 25' W

Monday Jan 17th

Thru 24 hours calm gained with the Cape Horn Pigeon 160 all told 75 of it spoke the Ospray  
Lat 33° 51' S  
Long 8° 20' W

Tuesday Jan 18th

First part calm C. W. Pigeon in sight middle fine breeze from N. N. W latter the same on different tack under all sail  
Lat 34° 02' S  
Long 8° 35' W

Wednesday Jan 19th

Commenced with fresh breeze from W. N. W steering S under all sail at night close reefed and luffed to the wind heading to the N latter more ship to the S  
Lat 33° 53' S  
Long 8° 15' W
