

Remarks On Board Barque Triton Of New Bedford McLehull

Thursday Jan 20th 1870

Commenced with fresh gale from W heading S at 4 P.M. wore ship to the N.W. Middle Moderate later the same wind W heading to the S.E. two whalers in sight

Lat 34° 08' S
Long 70° 50' W

Friday Jan 21st

Began with strong breeze from S.W. steering S.E. at night spoke Bark President Capt. Oliver 5 months out 80 S. later steering to the E saw four whalers

Lat 33° 55' S
Long 61° 53' W

Saturday Jan 22nd

First part fine breeze from S.W. heading S.E. middle wore ship latter light air & calm one whaler in sight

Sunday Jan 23rd

Commenced with fine breeze from W heading to the S.W. under all sail at night double reefed latter blowing strong double reefed to sail breeze

Lat 34° 54' S
Long 61° 30' W

Monday Jan 24th

Began with fresh gale from S.W. heading to the N.W. under short sail latter light air from W.S.W. heading N.W. two whalers in sight

Lat 34° 13' S
Long 61° 30' W

Tuesday Jan 25th

Commenced with light breeze from S steering W at night spoke the C. H. Pigeon and Bark Presidente 2nd Middle calm latter light air from N heading to the W 6 whalers in sight

Lat 34° 08' S
Long 71° 00' W

Wednesday Jan 26th

fine weather six sails in sight at night spoke Bark Globe 11 months out also spoke Ship Myrta 44 months out 2300 lbs all told

Lat 34° 43' S Long 71° 30' W

Thursday Jan 27th 1870

Commenced with strong breeze from N.W. heading to the W.S.W. under double reefed at 6 P.M. wore ship Middle wind from W & S latter fresh breeze from S.E. heading from N.W. to W one sail in sight the C. H. Pigeon

Long 81° 25' W

Friday Jan 28th

Commenced with fine breeze from S steering to the N.W. at night spoke the C. H. Pigeon latter fine breeze from N.W. to N.E. heading to the N.W. Pigeon in sight

Lat 34° 10' S
Long 91° 00' W

Saturday Jan 29th

Commenced with fine breeze from N heading to the E middle part on different tack under short sail latter fresh breeze from N.W. steering from N.E. to S.E. under all sail nothing in sight

Lat 33° 54' S
Long 81° 08' W

Sunday Jan 30th

First part fresh breeze from N.W. steering S under all sail saw the C. H. Pigeon at night shortened sail latter fine breeze from W steering S.E.

Lat 34° 00' S
Long 71° 30' W

Monday Jan 31st

Commenced with fine breeze from W steering S.E. under all sail at night shortened sail and luffed to the wind with the mainyard aback latter steering to the S.E. spoke the Ship Minerva 10 months two sails in sight

Lat 34° 26' S
Long 61° 00' W

Tuesday Feb 1st 1870

First part fine breeze from W heading to the N middle under short sail latter light air & calm heading to the N employed in repairing the mainsail four whalers in sight
