 ship under single reefed top sails  
 and main sail Middle part the same  
 latter part light wind whole top sail  
 No Ob  
 Started 250 gals water  
 Lat by Ob 50.04 S  
 Long by Obs 79.30 W

Tuesday Feb 6<sup>th</sup>  
 First part strong breeze whole top sails  
 thick rain weather one sail in sight  
 at 6 PM double reefed the top sails  
 Middle part the same latter  
 whole top sail at 9 AM saw a number  
 of porpoise seals landed the S. and S.  
 of boat J. boat in charge of Mr  
 King Starboard Boat Gardner  
 Lat by Ob 50.04 S  
 Long by Obs 79.30 W

Wednesday Feb 7<sup>th</sup>  
 First part strong breeze ship under  
 whole top sails five boats part to  
 a whale at 2 PM saw a ship  
 with six men on board and 80 fathoms  
 of line came aboard saw a number of whales  
 going quickly Middle and latter part  
 strong breeze double reefed top sails  
 No Ob  
 Lat by Ob 50.04 S  
 Long by Obs 79.30 W
