in evening at 5 P.M. Boat

sailed to them at 4:30 spoke middle and
latter calm

Saturday Jan 12th

First part light air and calm
at sunset took in sail set back as usual
watched Russian island bearing 40° 15' N. by
dial. Middle and latter light breeze
from the westward

Sunday Jan 13th

First part light breeze from westward
at sunset water land island bearing 40°
10' N. by dial ship heading then South east
middle and latter weather the same

Monday Jan 14th

First part light air and calm
at sunset the land was seen
bearing 40° 6' N. by dial ship heading to
the N.W. at 2 P.M. spoke ship Maynard
of New Bedford middle and latter part
same

Tuesday Jan 15th

First part light air and calm
middle and latter strong breeze from
Westward with heavy squalls of rain
