Monday Apr 21st

First part first breeze from
the westward ship under gins. sails
set sail Middle and latter strong
breeze from N. N. W. steering N. W.

Left by 5 12 1/2
Long. by 152 15 W

Tuesday Apr 22nd

First part strong breeze from
the westward with squalls of
hail and rain ship under close
sails then set sail and fore sail
Middle and latter the same

Left by 5 15 1/2
Long. by 151 36 W

Wednesday Apr 23rd

First part strong breeze from
the westward ship under close
sails at sunset took in sail
set Boat as usual at daylight made
all sail

Left by 5 2 00 W

On the North West Coast 1856

Thursday Apr 24th

First part strong breeze from
the south at 2 P.M. double reefed
at 4 P.M. close reefed the main top
sail and fasted the fore sail heading
to the southward Middle the same
latter calm with thick fog and heavy
swell

Left by 5 2 11 W

Friday Apr 25th

First part light breeze from the
westward with thick cloudy weather
Middle strong gale from westward ship
under close reefed main top sail
latter the same with hail and
snow

Saturday Apr 26th

First part gale from the west
ward ship under close reefed main
top sail Middle and latter the
same
