First part strong breeze from the South at 4 P.M. landed five Boats for a while. Bow Boat struck E. and A. Boats sailed at 9 P.M. out from him. Left fore hundred fathoms of line three junks, Middle and Latter employed bailing and fitting Boats



Wednesday July 9th

First part thick rainy weather with strong breeze from the south. Middle and Latter strong breeze from the Eastward with squalls of rain

First part strong gale from N.E. with rain at 8 P.M. finish bailing Middle and Latter weather the same employed stowing down

Friday July 11th

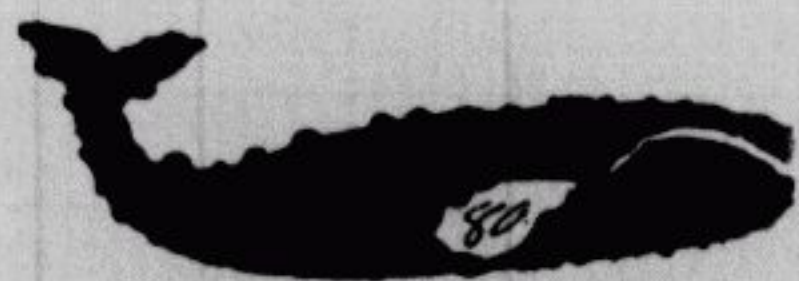
First part strong gale from the south. Employed stowing down Middle and Latter part blowing strong from the Eastward
