First part strong gale from the North at 1 P.M. spoke Bath Mary Sprague South side of *Paul Jones* bearing N. 2 miles dist kept off N.E. under double reefed top sail. Middle the same at 8 A.M. turned the sails out at the main top sail set main top by sight at 10. saw a dead whale left two lower decks to get fore jacks in to him and two lines fast to them took them to ship

First part strong gale from the North ship lying two miles close reefed driven top sail and spunkies at 3 P.M. parted and lying at 8 the anchor drawn set double reefed top sail and fore sail bearing to westward at 2 A.M. wore ship bearing N.E. at 6 kept off N.E. at 7 kept off N.E. saw nothing
