First part strong breeze which
let sails heading W. by N. Middle
and latter on different track

in the South Pacific

Wednesday Dec 3rd

First part fine weather all sail
heading S. by E. Middle and latter
very strongly of wind and sail
sent Master C. Bryant the goods forward to
state as before must hold 2 1/2

Thursday Dec 4th

First part moderate breeze all sail
heading S. by E. at 4 P.M. at 4 P.M.
the land of Motut bearing S. by E. 40 miles
dist to E. by Motut Middle and latter
fine weather at Motut bearing S
S. by E. dist

Friday Dec 5th

First part fine weather all sail
heading S. by E. Middle short sail
latter fine weather
