 Lat. 25.45 N Long 156.42 W Saturday 25 April 1857

Remarks on board first gale from the N.E. sharp on the wind to the N.W. ship under double reef weather dark and cloudy Middle part strong breezes from the N.E. sharp on the wind to the N.W. at 3 P.M. moderate set hole topsails and top gallant sails so continued the day

Lat. 27.35 N Long 157.25 W Sunday 26 April
 Com with fine and pleasant weather fresh breezes from N.E. sharp on the wind to the N.W. Middle part fresh breezes from latter part strong breezes from the N.E. sharp on the wind to the N.W. & N.W. weather squally. These men down sick with the Pox off duty

Lat. 29.24 N Long 158.07 W Monday 27 April
 Rem on board through the day fresh breezes from the N.E. sharp on the wind to the N.W. weather heavy and thick like squalls of rain Middle part more moderate. Latter part fine and pleasant the watch employed in ships duty wind from the N.E. sharp on the wind to the N.W. so end

Lat. 30.45 N Long 159.20 W Tuesday 28 April
 Com with fine and pleasant weather the watch employed in ships duty. Wind from the N.E. sharp on the wind to the N.W. Middle part fine and pleasant wind back to S. Course & later part the watch employed in ships duty so end the day

Lat. 32.02 N Long 158.51 W Tuesday 29 April
 Com with fine weather wind S.W. Course N.E. took the windings to leeward and cleaned it at 2 Am saw Blackfish leaved with out surfings came on board Middle part late air from S.W. Latter part the wind back to N. at 9 P.M. heavy squalls from the N.W. and late rain took in top gallant sails double reefed 4 & mizen topsails so end the day

Remarks on Board Ship Triton second Bound to Cadiz
 Wednesday 30 April 1857

Com with strong breezes from the N.E. sharp on the Eastern tank weather squally and thick ship under double reef Middle part the same at 7 P.M. wore ship to the N.W. wind N.E. set all sail sent down fore top gallant sail to mend so ends the 24 hours

Lat. 32.30 N Long 156.42 Thursday 1 May 1857
 Com with fresh breezes from the N.E. sharp on the wind to the N.W. at 3 P.M. sent down fore top gallant sail Middle part moderate Latter part the same sent out the bowsprit shrouds set up the Bob stays & sent the fore and main spencers so ends the day

Lat. 33.35 N Long 156.42 Friday 2 of May mistake
 Com with like air from N.E. sharp on the wind to the N.W. The watch employed in ships duty Middle part like air from the S. Course N.E. at 7 A.M. sent down the mainsail to repair at 11 A.M. sent up the main sail so end

Lat. 34.44 N Long 156.25 W Saturday 3 of May
 the watch employed in ships duty at 4 P.M. washed off the decks for the Sabbath Middle and latter part wind from the N.E. sharp on the wind to the N.W. so end

Lat. 35.04 N Long 156.25 W Monday 4 of May
 Com with fresh breezes from N.E. at 1 wore ship to the N.W. Middle part fresh breezes from the Eastward heading to the N.W. sharp on the wind latter part the same the watch employed in ships duty

Lat. 36.03 N Long Tuesday 5 of May
 Com with fresh breezes from the same the watch employed in ships duty saw 2 plain barks weather rather thick heading course Middle part fresh breezes from S. Course N.E. Latter part the same

Lat. 37.03 N Long 156.02 W Wednesday 6 of May
 Com with fresh breezes from S.E. Course N.E. weather rather heavy at 4 more moderate Middle part strong to the S.E. Course N.E. Latter part the same so ends the 24 hours
