

Remarks on Board Ship Triton ^{the} D. Whaling in Kamtschatka seas

Mr. Latt. 54.00. N. 166.10. W. Tuesday ^{the} 30. of June. 1857.

Com. fine & pleasant weather in the straits of Beavor quite calm and a very heavy current at 8. P.M. we were through through the straits at 7. P.M. the current changed and took the ship back as a gain in to the Atlantic Middle part fine and pleasant at 2. A.M. took a barge from the gulf and stood through through the straits a gain Kamtschatka seas a gain at 11. A.M. took a fine barge from S. side of shore to the N. so ends the toughest days work

Mr. Latt. Long chr. Wednesday July ^{the} 1. of July 1857.
Com heavy weather with from the S. bound to the N. with a fresh gale ship under S. topsails Middle & latter part moderate at 9. A.M. Comm. S. & B. wind. M. started ship & bread & sugar stowage back of the saw so ends the day. Mr. Rock on duty

Lat. Mr. 55.30. N. Long chr. 164.15. W. Thursday ^{the} 2. of July.

Com fine clear and moderate weather one ship in sight to the N. ward land in sight from S. to N. 6. Dist 30 Milder at 3. P.M. sent down fore top gallant sail & Condensed it sent down the main top gallant sail and sent an other New one. Middle part like air from S. W. Comm. S. & B. weather thick and foggy at 4. A.M. lost in to an Island one boat on shore for eggs sent natives on board during the day, 2 boats on shore all day so ends the day.

Mr. Latt. Long chr. Friday ^{the} 3. of July.
Com like wind from S.W. of and on the Island for eggs & a fresh Wallrus. to Capt. 5. P.M. came on board for the last time took in all toll about 1600 Eggs and one Wallrus Middle & latter part moderate at daylight spoke ship Emma's Bay harbor whale saw several ships all whaling at 11. A.M. saw whale and landed so ends the day.

Mr. Latt. Saturday ^{the} 4. of July.
Com fine & pleasant weather at 8. P.M. L. B. boat struck and Draved. S. B. L. boat struck & under whale took him to the ship at 11. Com cutting at 4. A.M. all in cleared the decks took breakfast sent the watch below at 11. A.M. comm. Mended Billings so ends the day very tired

Mr. Latt. Sunday ^{the} 5. of July.
Com fine and pleasant weather employed in boiling land in sight to the Eastward at 7. P.M. bound for whales middle part stowing latter part the same and thick foggy employed in boiling so ends the 24 hours.



Mr. Latt. Long chr. Monday ^{the} 6. of July

Remarks on board Ship Triton ^{the} D. in Bristol Bay whaling in. 1857.

Com thick foggy & rainy weather employed boiling ship under short sail at 7. P.M. saw whales loosed with out success at 11. came on board Middle & latter part thick foggy and heavy rain employed in boiling & scraping down ship under short sail so ends the 24 hours.

Mr. Latt. Long chr. Tuesday ^{the} 7. of July
Com thick foggy and rain at 1 P.M. saw whales loosed so go came on board. Middle part the same. Latter part quite clear weather & calm saw 3 ships. no whales all day being employed in boiling some saw several whales

Mr. Latt. Long chr. Wednesday ^{the} 8. of July.
Com thick and rainy weather like air from the Westward ship by the wind employed in boiling at sun down & ships in sight no whales. Middle part thick foggy latter part pleasant employed in stowing down at 7. am. cooled down the works so ends the day.

Lat 56.47. N Long chr 163.02. W. Thursday ^{the} 9. of July.
Com fine & pleasant weather employed in stowing down Middle & latter part fresh breezes from S.W. under short sail employed in stowing down in the after hole so ends the day.

Lat 56.21. N Long chr. 162.14. W. Friday ^{the} 10. of July.
Com fine and pleasant weather wind from the S. Courde. & S.W. land in sight to the S.E. Dist. 30, mild all hands employed in stowing down oil in the after hole gages of cask Middle & latter part calm at 7. A.M. saw whales loosed at 11. A.M. Lardor boat struck and killed a whale so ends the day.

Mr. Latt. Long chr. Saturday ^{the} 11. of July.
Com Moderate breezes from the S. employed in cutting at 1. P.M. Com cutting at 11.30. all in Middle & latter part thick & rainy employed in clearing the decks at 7. A.M. started the works the watch employed in various duties weather thick and calm. caught 4. codfish so ends the day.
Carpenter sick off duty

Mr. Latt. Long chr. Sunday ^{the} 12. of July.
Com thick foggy & calm calm employed in boiling at 7. P.M. the watch employed in scraping down. Middle & latter part moderate and thick foggy employed in boiling so ends the day.

Lat. Mr. Long chr. Monday ^{the} 13. of July.
Com fresh breezes from the N. and thick foggy ship under short sail employed in boiling at 7. P.M. spoke back of stowing down one whale the season Middle & latter part fresh gales from the N. all day in employed in boiling hudding to the N. so ends the 24 hours.
