

Remarks on Board ship Tutor & Co. Whaling in Bristol Bay  
 Mr. Salt Long. Chr. Monday 27 of July 1857.

Came fresh breezes thick foggy & rain all sail set heading to the N.E. at 7 P.M. took in sail for the net. Middle part thick foggy & raining at daylight quite clear set all sail course E.E. Wind N.W. saw 2 whales going to part to leeward latter part cloudy weather so ends.

Mr. Salt. 56. 37. N. Long. Chr. 163. 43. W. Tuesday 28 of July  
 Came fresh breezes & cloudy weather from the N.W. sharp on the wind to the N.E. all sail set at 8 P.M. thick foggy at 9 P.M. Shortland sail for the net. Middle & latter part strong breezes and thick foggy at 9 A.M. saw whales loared but no go came on board saw 3 ships to the S.E. so ends the day.

Mr. Salt. 56. 56. N. Long. Chr. 163. 43. W. Wednesday 29 of July  
 Came strong breeze from the W. and thick weather at 1 P.M. Loared for whales at 1.30 Mist boat struck at 4 P.M. took him to the ship at 6 P.M. Com cutting cut all with at 4 A.M. all in lost fin chaul ring parted at 6 took breakfast at 6. set the watch the watch employed in clearing up so ends



Mr. Salt. Long. Chr. Thursday 30 of July  
 Came fresh breezes and foggy weather at 1 P.M. Com boiling saw several whales at 6. loared but no go when from N.W. at 7. set the watch middle & latter part fine & pleasant weather employed in boiling so ends

Mr. Salt. 57. 50. N. Long. Chr. Friday 31 of July  
 Came fine and pleasant weather wind from W. course E. at 6 P.M. haul on the wind to the S.W. employed in boiling ship under double reef. at 6 started on bark of Bristol 171 gallons and one barrel of Beef. Middle & latter part strong breezes & thick foggy & rain ship under short sail heading to the N.W. Employed in boiling saw 2 ships so ends the 24 hours.

Mr. Salt. Long. Chr. Saturday 1 of August  
 Came strong breezes from the N.W. heading to S.W. ship under short sail weather quite clear employed in boiling at 6 P.M. wore ship to the S. Middle & latter part fresh breezes from N.W. heading to the S. ship under short sail & thick foggy employed in boiling so ends the 24 hours.

Remarks on Board ship Tutor & Co. Whaling in Bristol Bay in 1857.

Mr. Salt. Came fresh breezes and thick foggy from the N.W. heading to the S. at 1 P.M. got double reef topsails & fish saw 1 spoke one frank ship. none in known. Employed in boiling Middle & latter part fresh breezes from the N. sharp on the wind to the N.W. thick foggy Employed in boiling & fishing.

Mr. Salt. 56. 37. N. Long. Chr. 164. 36. W. Monday 3 of August 1857  
 Came moderate breezes from the W & thick foggy ship under short sail heading to the N.W. at 4 P.M. Coaled down the works cleared the decks for the net at 6.30. set double reef topsails quite clear. Middle & latter part moderate breezes thick foggy ship under short sail lying in. a. back employed in stowing down all forward caught 40 codfish wind from the W. heading to N.W. so ends

Mr. Salt. Long. Chr. Tuesday 4 of August  
 Came moderate weather and thick foggy wind W. heading N.W. Employed in stowing down oil forward ship under short sail caught 4 codfish Middle & latter part strong breeze from N. ship under short reef main topsails weather very thick employed in stowing down forward saw 2 ships

Mr. Salt. Long. Chr. Wednesday 5 of August  
 Came fresh gale from the W. ship under close reef main topsails at 1 P.M. spoke being dyport apt comstock a whale. Employed in stowing down in the after hold at 6 P.M. set double reef topsails heading to the S. Middle & latter part strong breezes from N. heading S.W. weather thick & heavy not much going so ends the day.

Mr. Salt. Long. Chr. Thursday 6 of August  
 Came fresh breezes & thick weather from the N. heading to the S.W. Double reef topsails. Middle & latter part fresh breezes from the W. heading to the S.W. sharp on the wind all sail set weather quite clear and nothing to be seen but birds so ends the 24 hours.

Mr. Salt. 55. 36. N. Long. Chr. 164. 28. W. Friday 7 of August  
 Came fresh breezes and cloudy weather from the N.W. at 2 P.M. wore ship to the S. all sail set not much going at 6 P.M. saw the land bearing E. Dist 35 Miles Middle & latter part fresh breezes from the W. & thick foggy sharp on the wind to the S.W. all sail set so ends

Mr. Salt. 56. 11. N. Long. Chr. Saturday 8 of August  
 Came moderate breezes from the W & thick foggy sharp on the wind to the N.W. at 6 P.M. saw one old cables at 6 P.M. took in top gallant sails and courses for the net. Middle part ship under S. topsails thick foggy latter part the same quite calm caught a number of fish at 11 P.M. Moderate breezes from the S.W. sharp on the wind to N.W. clear at weather at times nothing seen through the day cooper at work setting reef shoaks so ends the 24 hours.
