

Remarks on Board ship Triton. ^{the} D. Cruising off St. Matthews. 1857.
 Mon. Lat. 66.52. N. Long. 41. W. Tuesday ^{the} 15. off Sept.

Com fresh gales and thick foggy weather from the N.W. ship by the wind under short sale. Middle and latter part moderate weather thick foggy and rainy weather at 7. A.M. saw the land course S.E. wind from the N.W. so ends the 24 hours.

Mr. Lat. 60.42. N. Long. 41. W. Wednesday ^{the} 16. off Sept.

Com lite air from N.W. course S.W. by E. weather thick and foggy and lite rain at 3. P.M. saw whale leaved for Mark. D.B. went on to one, but it was another site in the boat clear not starting so the whale went off unfastened at the dark calm the land dist. 5. miles with a heavy swell heaving on shore. Middle and latter part moderate saw whales but small scraps weather thick and cloudy.

Mr. Lat. Long. 41. W. Thursday ^{the} 17. off Sept.

Com strong breezes and thick cloudy weather saw a few whaling boats leaved for them but no go could not get on to them at 3. P.M. came on board run down the lea side of the island at 6. P.M. course S.E. by S. leaving the island behind. Middle & latter part fresh gales from N.W. course S.E. by S. all sail set to the best advantage so ends the day.

Mr. Lat. 59.07. N. Long. 41. W. Friday ^{the} 18. off Sept.

Com fresh gales from N.W. course S. all sail set to the best advantage. Middle & latter part fresh gales from the N.W. course S. ship under double reef topsails so ends the 24 hours.

Mr. Lat. 57.37. N. Long. 41. W. Saturday ^{the} 19. off Sept.

Com strong gales and squally weather from the N.W. course S. by compass ship under double reef topsails Middle & latter part strong breezes from the N. course from E. to S.W. at 7. A.M. saw the island St. Pauls to the S.W. at 10. bore N. dist. 5. miles saw several ships so ends the 24 hours.

Mr. Lat. 57.00. N. Long. 41. W. Sunday ^{the} 20. off Sept.

Com strong breezes and clear weather land in sight to the S. and St. George in sight to the S.E. dist. 30. Middle & latter part lite air from the N.W. ship between the islands so ends.

Remarks on Board ship Triton. ^{the} D. Cruising for whales. 1857.
 Mr. Lat. 56.41. N. Long. 41. W. Monday ^{the} 21. off Sept.

Com lite air from the N. bore S.E. one ship in sight and the island of St. George bearing N. dist. 14. miles at 2. P.M. saw one Boobial leaved for him but no go came on board at 4. P.M. spoke Bergina to President of Green Port. 10. whaler. 900 Bbls Middle & latter part strong breezes from the E. at daylight course N.W. at 10. A.M. the wind shifted to the S. with fresh gales double reefed the topsails took in the courses weather thick & rainy so ends.

Lat. Long. 41. W. Tuesday ^{the} 22. off Sept.

Com fresh gales from the S. bore two under short sale weather thick and rainy heaving to the S.E. Middle & latter part strong gales from the S.W. bore two so ends.

Mr. Lat. 55.42. N. Long. 41. W. Wednesday ^{the} 23. off Sept.

Com strong gales from the N.W. heaving S. bore two short sale at 3. P.M. lost reefed the main top sail blowing on thick & rainy. Middle and latter part strong gales from the N.W. ship by the wind to the S.W. under lost reef main topsails and spinnaker at 11. A.M. set double topsails course S. little more moderate & ends.

Lat. 55.12. N. Long. 41. W. Thursday ^{the} 24. off Sept.

Com fresh gales from N.W. course S. under double reef top sails and fore sail. Middle and latter part fresh breezes from N. course S. at 7. A.M. saw the land to S.S.E. course S.W. so ends.

Lat. 53.31. N. Long. 41. W. Friday ^{the} 25. off Sept.

Com moderate breezes from the N. course S. by W. land to the eastward dist. 20. miles at 1. P.M. saw sail a head at 3. P.M. bent new fore top gallant sail at 5 course S. by E. Middle & latter part fine & clear off and on the Fox Islands with the wind to the N.W. at daylight ship under course through the 170 passage at 12. all clear so ends.

Lat. 52.35. N. Long. 41. W. Saturday ^{the} 26. off Sept.

Com fine and pleasant weather course S. by compass wind N.W. all sail set to the best advantage at 3. P.M. set fore top Mast shearing sail at 4. P.M. put the anchor on the bows at dark the Fox Islands barely in sight. Middle & latter part moderate and fine clear weather bent new studding sails so ends.

Lat. 51.14. N. Long. 41. W. Sunday ^{the} 27. off Sept.

Com fine and clear weather all sail set course S.E. wind N.W. Middle & latter part fine weather at 3. P.M. the wind hove to the S.E. ship by the wind to the S.W. all sail set to the best advantage so ends the 24 hours.
