

Remarks on Board Ship Triton A.D. Bound in to Mohee 1857.

Our strong V.E. trader and Squally at 1 P.M. made the Island off Moke at a head dist. 40. miles at 2. started Reef and Park at 4 P.M. bent the cables and took the Anchors off the Bows. Middle and Scatter Part Strongy trades at Midnight hove two off the Passage at 4.5. Am Lander on molo kai our Boat at 7. Came on board started for Lahina at 11. off the harbor capt went on Shore to end the Day

Oct 24. Fine and pleasant weather off
and in the harbor at 1 P.M. orders came on board
to come to an anchor at 2.30 let go the anchor at
Sakine at 3 our bundling went to work
Latter part finished bundling the beam, shipped
it on board of the Mary L Sutton of Mystic
Capt Charles C. Lissou, weighing 7110 lbs
Latterly landed a Keg of Casks for water

Sunday Oct 25th Light Trades from 8 to 12 and
pleasant weather with hazy and sent part
of the crew on Liberty

Monday Oct 26th Light airs and pleasant weather Employed painting Ship

Tuesday Oct 27th

Light airs from S.W. and Clear weather

Employed getting off and Stowing Down Water
Cooper repairing Casks for Staves and Water
Mr Wright Chief Officer and Mr Hunt left
the Ship. Mr Boyd Cammenced as 1st Officer
And Mr Rock as 2nd Discharge Mr Johnson
and the Steward J. John Harrison, 1 Boat Steerer ~
George Reed, farmost hand, Bill Logan, Tom Hoan
John Barney, E. Stone, The Dane Miller,
Hanera, Kanakai, Namau, Kanakui

and various other jobs, sent a raft ashore
for water, Discharge George Reed Boatsteerer
so ends this day.

Friday Oct 30th Moderate and pleasant weather

Wind from S.W. Landward watch on Liberty
the Rest Employed fitting a new flying
jibb stay and building a potatoe pen
sold a new boat the Spain one to Capt Potter
Boath Antelope, Discharged 6 Kanakas and
3 white men namely Edward B Stone,
Theodore Lehman & John Manney.

Saturday Oct 31st fine pleasant weather, wind from N.E. Employed Staining, Dyeing, water and other jobs Starboard watch on Liberty

Sunday Nov 1st Moderate ~~wind~~ Clear weather
Lanboar & watch an Liberty So Ends

Monday Nov 2nd fine pleasant weather wind
from Wind from SE got off 3665 lbs of bread
56 kegs of flour 9 Bbls pork 16 Bbls Beef
4 kegs of peas & beans & the remainder of
300 Bbls of water shipped and boatmen
named Daniel Harrison & farmst men
named Charles Turner, Martin Crandle,
John Kindley Host Peter,
Received also 3 Bbls of Molasses
