Wednesday Jan 13th Begins with a light breeze from N.W. and cloudy at 6 p.m. blowing strong with rain, shortened sail for the night, latter part more moderate, ship heading S by W, under all sail, but hauld
Obs^d Lat by D.R. 41.10 South

Thursday Jan 14th First part a strong breeze from N.W. and cloudy, heading South, at sundown blowing a gale ship under the close reef & maintop sail & foresail, saw 2 grampuses, latter part like the first
Obs^d Lat 41.57 S Long by Chro 160.40 W

Friday Jan 15th Begins with a strong gale from S.W. and cloudy, ship heading S by E at 7 p.m. saw a ship heading about S.E., middle part more moderate, latter part a light breeze all sail set, but hauld
Obs^d Lat 42.36 South

Saturday Jan 16th Begins with a light breeze from W.S.W. and clear, heading S by E set whole catches middle part a fresh breeze, at daylight passed the above ship steering S.E. employed repairing the flying jib & sails blowing strong
Obs^d Lat 44.23 S Long by Chro 159.37

Sunday Jan 17th First part a strong breeze from N.W. and cloudy, steering S by E at sundown double reefed the topsails middle and latter parts thick and rainy
Lat by D.R. 46.00 South

Monday Jan 18th First a fresh breeze from N.W. and rain, at 4 p.m. saw some whales lowered 3 boats after them, they proved to be Finbacks, course S by E, middle part laying to under the close reef & main topsail at daylight put off S.E. and blowing a gale and cloudy

Tuesday Jan 19th Begins blowing a gale from N.W. and cloudy, course S by E, middle and latter parts wind from N.W. to S.W. steering from S by E to E by S under double reef & fore and main topsails and foresail

Remarks Onboard

Wednesday Jan 20th first part blowing a gale from N.W. and cloudy, middle and latter parts blowing strong whole topsails and maintopgaleant set, weather clear, saw a ship to the Northward heading Eastward, have new foretop sail hauled
Obs^d Lat 49.27 S, Long by Chro 148.33 West

Thursday Jan 21st first part fresh gale from N.W. and clear, course S by E, middle part moderating, latter part a light breeze from West, course S by E under all sail, unbent the jib sheeted & heaved it
Obs^d Lat 50.19 S Long by Chro 145.43 West

Friday Jan 22nd Begins with a light breeze from West and clear, course S by E middle and latter parts same weather, course S by E, employed repairing the fore topsail, but up the fore spencer and a fore topmast standing sail for it
Obs^d Lat 50.51 S Long by Chro 142.59 West

Saturday Jan 23rd Begins with a moderate breeze from W and light squalls at times, middle and latter parts same weather employed refitting the jib stay and other small jobs. saw some Finbacks.
Obs^d Lat 51.15 South

Sunday Jan 24th First part a light breeze from West and clear, steering East, middle part the same, latter part wind increasing and hauling Northward with cloudy weather, Lat 57.40 South

Monday Jan 25th Begins with a strong gale from N by W and rain steering E by S under double reef, topsails & courses middle part like the first, latter part more moderate set sail accordingly
Obs^d Lat 53.03 S, Long by Chro 132.37 West,

Tuesday Jan 26th First part a moderate breeze from West and clear, steering East under all sail middle part the same, latter part wind from S by W, and cloudy, ship heading E by S, employed breaking out water
Obs^d Lat 54.08 S
