Wednesday Jan 27th Begins with a light breeze from N^W and Cloudy
At 4 p.m. got a fine breeze from W. by S. Steering E by N Middle and
Latter parts a strong breeze and Cloudy, Steering East, Carried
Away a fore topmast studding sail boom
Obs Lat 54.39 S, Long by Chron 121.49 West

Thursday Jan 28th first part a strong breeze from West
And Cloudy with squalls at times, Steering E by N under all
sail, middle part blowing strong with rain, latter part moderate
And Cloudy
Obs Lat 54.44 South, Long 120.39 W

Friday Jan 29th Begins with a moderate breeze from W by S
Steering East with all sail, weather dark and Cloudy, Middle
And latter parts a fine breeze and Cloudy, Saw Porpoises, Course E by N
Obs Lat 54.47 S, Long by Chron 116.58 W

Saturday Jan 30th First part a fine breeze from W. S. W.
And Cloudy, Steering E by N, all possible sail set, Middle
And latter parts wind from S^W and squally
Obs Lat 54.39 S, Long by Chron 113.25 W

Sunday Jan 31st First part a fresh breeze from S^W
And squally, Steering E by N, Middle and latter parts blowing
a gale with heavy squalls and snow
Obs Lat 54.27 S, Long by Chron 108.29 W

Monday Febr 1st first part blowing a gale from
S^W and heavy snow squalls, Steering E by S under double
reef S, & M. topsails and fairsail Middle and latter
parts wind from S^E and under close reef topsails & fairsail
Obs Lat 54.44 S, Long by Chron 104.23 W

Tuesday Febr 2nd first parts blowing strong from S by E
And squally, Steering E by S Middle and latter parts moderate
wind hauling to the westward all sail set Steering East
Obs Lat 54.08 South

Wednesday Febr 3rd first part a fresh breeze from N and
rain, Steering East, Middle part light S by E and rain, latter part
wind from East and Cloudy, Ship on Landward tack
Obs Lat 53.22 South

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Thursday Febr 4th First part a light breeze hauling to S^E
and Cloudy, wore ship and headed E by N Middle part like the first
Latter part wind from S^W and clear, Repaired the spanker
Obs Lat 53.43 S, Long by Chron 96.39 West

Friday Febr 5th First part a light breeze from S^W and clear
Steering E by N, at 10 p.m. wind from W. S. W., latter part a light
breeze from N^E by N and Cloudy heading E by N, Employed working
a new cutting fall
Obs Lat 56.01 South

Saturday Febr 6th Begins with a moderate breeze from S^E and
Cloudy, Ship heading E by S, Middle and latter wind from S^E
to S. E. and Cloudy at 3 p.m. tacked and headed N^E
Obs Lat 57.00 S, Long by Chron 94.06 West

Sunday Febr 7th first part a fresh breeze from S^E and
Cloudy, with squalls at times, Ship heading E by N Middle
And latter part blowing strong with heavy squalls and
snow at times, Ends with ship under her close reef fore &
Main topsails and fairsail, heading N^E
Lat by D. R. 56.30 South

Monday Febr 8th first part blowing a gale from S^E &
And rain, Ship heading N^E Middle and latter part more
moderate set sail accordingly latter part heading E by N
Lat by Chron 56.39 S, Long by Chron 88.13 W

Tuesday Febr 9th first part a strong breeze from S^E and
Cloudy, Steering E by N, Middle part more moderate wind hauling
westward, latter part a light air from S^W and Cloudy
Lat by D. R. 57.05 South

Wednesday Febr 10th begins with a light air from S^W
And Cloudy, Steering E by S Middle part calm, latter
part a light air from south and clear Employed working
out water &c
Obs Lat 57.18 S, Long by Chron

Thursday Febr 11th first part a light breeze from S^W
And clear, Steering E by S Middle part wind from S^W
Latter part a fine breeze from S^W and Cloudy
Obs Lat 57.24 South
