And Cloudy steering E by S. Middle part light airs, Latter
part a moderate breeze from N.E. ship heading E.S.E.
Lat by D.R. 58.14 South

Sunday Feb 14th first part wind increasing from N.E.
with Rain, ship heading E.S.E. Middle part wind variable
Latter part a strong breeze from South and a heavy sea from
N.W. Course N.E. by N. weather Cloudy

Monday Feb 15th begins with a fresh breeze from S.E.
And Cloudy, steering N.W. Middle and Latter parts wind
from E by S. ship heading E by S. saw a ship steering westward
Obs^d Lat 56.58 South

Tuesday Feb 16th first a strong breeze E. by N. And Cloudy
Ship heading N by E at 6 p.m. saw the Diego Ramenies
bearing N.E. Dist 10 miles tacked and headed S by W at 1 A.M.
wind hauled to S.E. tacked and headed E by S under Double
Keel & Topsails foresail & Keel^d Mainsail, saw a ship steering W by S
Obs^d Lat 56.58 S. Long by Chs 67.37 West

Wednesday Feb 17th first part a strong breeze from S.E. and
Cloudy, at 1 p.m. put off N.E. under a reef of sail Middle
part wind light hauling round to the westward. Latter part
a moderate breeze from N.W. and heavy heading N.E. Can. demmed
an old foresail and cut it up

and heavy weather, ship heading N.E. Middle and Latter parts

W.S.W. Latter part thick fog & Calm, saw a ship bound bound N.E.

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Saturday Feb 20th first part a moderate breeze from N.W. and thick
fog ship heading N.W. Middle part wind from N heading E.N.E.
at 4 A.M. tacked and headed W.S.W. Latter part a strong breeze and
Cloudy ship under Double Keel & topsails

Sunday Feb 21st begins with a strong breeze from N.W.
And Clear, ship heading West, Middle and Latter parts like
the first

Monday Feb 22nd first part a fresh breeze from N.W.
and heavy weather, ship heading W by S at 5 p.m. tacked and
headed N.E. Middle and Latter parts like the first

Tuesday Feb 23rd first part a light breeze from N.W. and
heavy weather, ship heading N.E. Middle part heading E by N
at 5 A.M. tacked and headed N.W. at 11 saw Beaufort Island
Head at Noon Landed with 2 Boats
Lat 52.43 S

Wednesday Feb 24th begins with a fresh breeze from N.E. at 2
p.m. boats came off with about 150 birds put off West, at 1 A.M.
blowing a heavy gale from W.S.W. with Rain wind still hauling
westward ship heading N.W. under Close Keel & fore and Main
Topsails Labouring, hand loose ship and headed South, at 7 A.M.
more moderate put off East under Double Keels
Lat 53.07 S. Long by Chs 59-14 West

Thursday Feb 25th first part blowing strong from N.W.
And Cloudy, steering N.E. by E under Double Keel & Topsails
At 5 A.M. more moderate set all sail & steered N.E. by E
saw a ship steering N.E. and S steering N.W. weather Clear
Obs^d Lat 52.25 S. Long by Chs 58.03 W

Friday Feb 26th first part a moderate breeze from West
and Clear, ship heading N.W. Middle part wind hauled
to N.W. heading E.N.E. at 4 A.M. tacked ship latter part
blowing a gale from N.W. heading West S.W. under
Close Keel & Topsails and foresail sea running high
Obs^d Lat 51.32 S. Long by Chs 58.57 W
