hozy weather, heading N^W & Middle and Latter parts like first
Obs Lat 29.31 S Long by Chron 37.57 W

Wednesday March 31st first part a fresh breeze from East
And Clear, heading N^W & Middle and Latter parts like
the first but hauld, Lost our head Nail
Obs Lat 27.12 S Long by Chron 36.36 W

Thursday April 1st first part a strong breeze from E by S
And Cloudy, heading N^W by S under single reef, Middle and
Latter part squally Double reef the Topsails
Obs Lat 25.03 S Long by Chron 35.47 W

Friday April 2nd first part a strong breeze from E by S
And squally heading N^W & Middle and Latter parts wind
varying from N^W to East but hauld -
Lat by D. R. 23.50 South

Saturday April 3rd Begins with squally weather and rain
wind coming from N^W & to East ship by the wind, Middle
And Latter parts Clear, Employed shifting the spars over the stern
Obs Lat 22.30 S Long by Chron 33.20 W

Sunday April 4th first part a moderate breeze from N^W &
And Clear heading N^W Middle part wind N^W by S heading E by S
Saw a Large ship steering Southward, Spawning a Leak 100 Shooks -
per hour,
Obs Lat 21.41 S Long by Chron 36.00 W

Monday April 5th first and Middle parts a light variable
Air and Rain at times, Latter part a moderate breeze from
N^W & ship heading N^W & but hauld
Obs Lat 21.37 S Long by Chron 33.49 W

Tuesday April 6th A light breeze from N^W & to E by S and
Clear pleasant weather Ship by the wind on different tacks
Employed careously
Obs Lat 21.46 S Long by Chron 33.09 W

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Wednesday April 7th these 24 hours light airs and variables
Ship by the wind but hauld
Obs Lat 22.20 S Long by Chron 32.33 West

Thursday April 8th these 24 hours light winds from N^W & and
Cloudy weather, Ship by the wind on different tacks
Obs Lat 21.40 S Long by Chron 32.36 West

Friday April 9th these 24 hours a fresh breeze from N^W & to
East attended with squalls at times, ship heading about North
passed 5th sail bound South, spoke one the Lady Penvenhery
from Hull England, bound to Mount aside with Coal
Obs Lat 20.14 South

Saturday April 10th these 24 hours a fresh breeze from N^W &
to East throughout with squalls at times, ship heading
from N^W to N^W & 3 ships passed us, 2 bound North
And one South

Sunday April 11th Light winds from East and Clear weather
Ship heading N^W & with all sail, saw a sail bound South
Obs Lat 16.55 South Long by Chron 32.51 W

Monday April 12th Light Trades from East to E by S
And pleasant weather, ship heading about N^W & Employed
Rigging our Spain sails for staysails Coalsack sail & c & c
but hauld but fore Royal Obs Lat 15.22 South Long 32.20 West

Tuesday April 13th Begins with a light breeze from E by S
And Clear, heading N^W by S Middle and Latter parts
like the first, Saw a Brig steering Southward
Obs Lat 13.46 S Long by Chron 31.43 W

Wednesday April 14th Begins with a moderate breeze
from E by S and Clear ship heading N^W & Middle and
Latter parts like the first, but hauld
Obs Lat 11.46 S Long by Chron 30.57 W
