Light ~~W. S. W.~~ breeze and foggy
saw and caught a  Observation

Wednesday Aug 22nd

Commenced with light breeze
from N. Middle and latter part wind hauled S.W.
squally and very rugged. Commenced cutting
at 6 A.M. finished at sunset lay by the cable through
the night.

Thursday Aug 23rd

Moderate breeze from N. N. W.
with squalls of rain. Took in up, case, cleared
up decks and started the watches at 4 P.M.

Lat. 42. 29 N.
Lon. 30. 12 W.

Friday Aug 24th

Light air from N. W. and N.
with some rain first part. latter part fine
weather. Employed boiling

Lat. 42. 34 N.
Lon. 30. 05 W.

Saturday Aug 25th

Fine breeze from W. and
N. W. and fair weather. Finished boiling at 12 M.

Lat. 44. 50 N.
Lon. 30. 18 W.

Ocean on board Tack Tropic Bird of New Bedford.

Fresh breeze from N. W. and fair
Lat. 42. 34 N.
Lon. 30. 55 W.

Monday Aug 27th

First part fresh breeze from N. W.
and cloudy, latter part light air from N. N. W. with
fine weather. Seeing S. W. Saw 3 sails.

Lat. 41. 12 N.
Lon. 31. 27 W.

Tuesday Aug 28th

First part calm, latter part
fine breeze from Land N. N. W.

Lat. 40. 37 N.
Lon. 31. 43 W.

Wednesday Aug 29th

Moderate breeze and fine weather
At 1 A.M. made the island of Long bearing S. W. dist 16
miles.

Thursday Aug 30th

Fresh breeze from W. and fine
weather. At 1 P.M. left away S. E. at 12 M. S. E. at
9 A.M. made the isle of Fayal bearing S. E. dist 35
miles, Saw three sails.

Lat. 38. 41 N.
Lon. 28. 18 W.

Friday Aug 31st

First part fresh breeze from
E. N. E. and rainy, latter part fair with light
air from E.

Castelo Branco
bearing S. E. dist 8 miles

Saturday Sept. 1st

Light E. breeze and fine
weather At 8 A.M. went ashore at Fayal, at sunset
stood out S. W. with breeze from S. E. Landed 175 gallons
oil

Off Fayal.
