Sunday Feb. 2nd

First part calm, At day light discovered that 3 men had deserted, viz. John Lake, Geo. Hiley & Oliver S. Mendall, seamen. Cleared decks and got under way at 10th A.M. Bound to the leeward in company with the Milinotet

Fresh breezes and fine weather

Fresh breezes and fair weather
Working up to Ann's Bow. Put out spare boat on Laid and cranes

Lon. 5. 35 E.

Wednesday Feb. 5th

Breeze and fair weather. At 5 P.M. went ashore at Ann's Bow, came off at sunset and steamed S.E. by the wind. Painted Laidboard two

Lat. 1. 57 S.
Lon. 5. 33 E.

Thursday Feb. 6th

Pleasant breezes and fine weather. Saw & chased for 2 hrs. without success. Caught 2 black fish

Lat. 2. 10 S.
Lon. 7. 30 E.

Ocean on board bark Tropic Bird of N. Bedford

Friday Feb. 8th

Moderate breeze and pleasant weather. Saw Black fish

Lat. 2. 42 S.
Lon. 7. 30 E.

Saturday Feb. 9th

First part squally with some rain. latter part fair

Lon. 7. 45 E.

Sunday Feb. 10th

Light breezes and fair weather

Lat. 3. 23 S.
Lon. 7. 47 E.

Monday Feb. 11th

Moderate breeze and fair weather. Antonio S. Parain sick

Lat. 3. 55 S.
Lon. 8. 32 E.

Tuesday Feb. 12th

Light winds with some rain. Spike back Milinotet. Wm. Wright, A. Alexander & Antonio S. Parain off deck sick By the wind

Lat. 3. 45 S.
Lon. 8. 20 E.

Wednesday Feb. 13th

Breeze and fair weather. Heaving by the wind

Lat. 4. 22 S.
Lon. 9. 28 E.

Thursday Feb. 14th

First part light air, latter part fine breeze from N.E.W.

Lat. 5. 13 S.
Lon. 9. 25 E.

Friday Feb. 15th

First part breeze from N.E.W. & S.W. W. latter part from S.W. with some showers. Saw a dead wh., and a bark to windward

Lat. 6. 03 S.
Lon. 9. 18 E.
