Strong breeze, Warped ship to W. Sawing off. Let go starboard anchor

Thursday Oct. 2nd

Watch on liberty. Waiting for oil in consequence of the crane being out of order.

Friday Oct. 3rd

Employed breaking out water & stowing off aft.

Saturday Oct. 4th

Received one lighter load of oil from shore, landed from Bark Kathleen

Watch on liberty

Ocean on board bark Tropic Bird of New Bedford

Monday Oct. 6th

Employed stowing oil, received one lighter load

Tuesday Oct. 7th

Received two lighter loads of oil

Wednesday Oct. 8th

Received one lighter load of oil.

Thursday Oct. 9th

Received one lighter load of oil leaking, one oiled & three hooks.

Friday Oct. 10th

Employed in stowing oil and shaking casks

Saturday Oct. 11th

Employed stowing off, and taking on board provision

Sunday Oct. 12th

Crew on liberty

Monday Oct. 13th

Employed clearing of decks finished stowing oil.

Tuesday Oct. 14th

Fine breeze. Took starboard and got ready for sea. At 11h Am. took on anchor and lay off for till 2 P.M. came on board and kept away 1h 1/2. at 3 P.M. M.M.W. with fresh breeze. Hail in sight. At sunset St Helena. S.E. dist 17 miles
