

May 1834 Good Midway Ground

Thursday 10th the Post boat Employed in killing Salmon
at 000 with Abnag with from S. & S. and Calhoun
Lodge 00 weather and took the 2nd wharf along side
at 11 o'clock Latter boat and under Mount
Lake and Put in the 2nd wharf for Millers
Lake fish processors will furnish cutting
at the above 2nd wharf

Sunday 11th The first boat employed in cutting blubber
 left 10^o and put the first underway. Other boats left 11^o
 12^o 1^o 2^o 3^o 4^o 5^o 6^o 7^o 8^o 9^o 10^o 11^o 12^o 1^o 2^o 3^o 4^o 5^o 6^o 7^o 8^o 9^o 10^o 11^o 12^o

 in Baiting and in the morning five
 whales and land was bait. But they were
 gaining quick to the windward, so we
 quit home this day and put a different
 and found we had killed a large one
 several when we put the 13th whale to sea

at sundown the 8 wheel making 180 lbs
Ltr 95-30 nothing to count

Tuesday 13th Commenced with Moderator P. G. Bates
Left 1-17 and reached here to get to the Southward
by 4-48 in hopes to fall in with the fish again
Latter part employed in procuring S. D.

Monday 14th this Post sent Embroid in Crapine
At 28 pence Basket out in the maine with me
to New Quenneville latter Post
Lpd 000 Embroid in Staining Thru and
Goulds Linnell at once Basket out
but the same at rather sent to East

Thursday 18th to Fort Point Camp near in Shaving
Left 10-1608^{hrs} and arrived at Riverdown latter
Left 7-40^{hrs} and reached the ship to end.

Friday 16th The first part Commences with Moderate
SE trades to the anes and all hands
Embark in washing their baggage
Sept 17-18 The first employ in carrying nothing and
the voyage will become dreadfully hard to bear

Saturday 24th the Breeze with fresh winds from
 S. S. E. steaming by the aid of height
 with the ship's masts all sail to sea and
 to the off made a good run for it is a distance
 of 44-64 miles to get to the Eastward where we
 are to go to the Eastward to get on the
 opposite shore we get over a whole and
 the ship with masts about one mile at day
 later but the same to end

Thursday, 18th the barometer with gentle wind rose 5th 2
 44.2 = 32 During P.M. and in the morning there
 Whales and several all 2 boats and put me
 hands to their small lines but their lines
 not with me then I have got to catch
 and sent off to the 4 E. S. boat up and
 Boats and continued our course to End!

Mon. 31st Commences with gentle S. breeze strong
#3-21 S. & B. rather moist the same and
Leaves 10 Saw nothing? so ends this day?

 At 4-00 P M used fine Black ink and finished
 at 8-00 P M just the same to each all well.
