18th Commenced with fine trades and beautiful
 clear weather and Broke out in the same
 hole to Hare Cove and at 10 P.M. hauled
 3 Quarts and the Capt. got a fine Chance
 for a 60 lbs Whaler. But the Boat Stopped
 just before Hare. He also used and that
 Broke and so we could not get a 2nd Chance
 and took up the Quarts and Commenced
 hunting. I saw what we had to get what
 Salmon & other man sent to Nantucket. I
 saw the Prince is there for 40 days up a ship &
