Friday Sept. 26th 1812
begins with strong wind from N.E. at 2 AM
Doubtless reefed the top sails & at 4 AM at 6
took in Miz top sail & at 8 AM the wind to the
S.E. at 8 AM commenced blowing a. v. gale. took
in fore & Miz top sails latter part blowing
strong reefed the fore sail. Lat. 36.07 N
Long 24.00 W

Saturday Sept. 27th 1812
Mete. Moderate. set fore & Miz top sails close
reefed head up. Since the latter part strong
wind & clear weather. a strong easterly
breeze. Lat. 35.07 N
Long 23.42 W

Sunday Sept. 28th 1812
begins with strong wind from E.N.E. at 6 AM
the wind to the S.E. at 6 PM took in fore &
Miz top sails latter part moderate set all
sails. see nothing. Lat. 34.47 N
Long 23.42 W

Monday Sept. 29th 1812
light wind & fine weather. spoke 4.15
beam down. 6 AM clear. at 8 AM clear
Miz & latter part fine weather beam in
comp. supplied her with bread. Lat. 34.32 N
Long

Tuesday Sept. 30th 1812
Moderate land from N.W. at 10 AM to the S.E. at
7 PM. Masted sail. at 8 AM. Miz & latter
part moderate. at 6 AM to the S.E. calm
fore top sails to mend. Lat. 33.43 N
Long 21.41 W

Wednesday Oct. 1st 1812
begins with a fresh breeze from the N.W. the
clouds finished mending & lent. of top sail
at 7 AM took in fore & Miz top sails at 8 AM
wind to the N.W. latter part moderate &
some clouds at 6 AM steered to the S.E.
unlent the main sail to mend. Lat. 33.02 N
Long 21.26 W

Cruising by the steam Grampus Oct. 1st 1812
Thursday Oct. 2nd 1812
commenced with moderate wind from N.W. &
finished mending the main sail lent the same.
see see Grampus. at 7 PM at 8 AM the wind to the
East. latter part cloudy unlent. set 4 stay sail
to mend. Lat.

Friday Oct. 3rd 1812
begins with strong wind from E.N.E. close.
reefed fore top sail. Doubtless reefed the main. at 8 AM
the wind to the N.W. lent. set 4 stay sail.
Miz & latter part strong breeze. Lat. 33.25 N
Traces from E to E.N.E. Long 21.29 W

Saturday Oct. 4th 1812
commenced with fresh breeze from East attended
with a high swell. see one sail & one piece
line track. Spurn Whales their appearances to be
more about here. signs of snow. Miz part
tacked to the South. at 10 AM cloudy & some
rain. paper a big. No Ws

Sunday Oct. 5th 1812
commenced with moderate wind from
the East & cloudy. headed to the North. Miz
part tacked to the S.E. latter part fresh breeze
see 2 sail. at 4 AM at 6 AM. Lat. 33.37 N
Long 21.17 W

Monday Oct. 6th 1812
fresh breeze & cloudy at 6 PM steered by the wind
to the S.E. under short sail. Miz & latter part
strong wind & squally at 7 AM at 8 AM. Lat. 32.17 N
Long 20.01 W

Tuesday Oct. 7th 1812
begins with strong wind from East at 2 PM at 4 PM
at 6 PM took in Miz top sail. Miz &
latter part strong breeze at 7 AM at 8 AM. latter
unlent the Miz top sail to mend. Lat. 30.10 N
Long 19.34 W

W & traces
