

1873 Ship Unear Round - East

Friday November 10th

11 Days out Commences with fresh breeze from N.W. steering S.E. by E. under all sail turned down the greater boats. Middle & blowing a gale took in storming sails and uped the top sails turned up the Boats again blowing a gale under Latter Part main sail set fore top most sideing sail blowed it away off another and split it all to pieces so ends this day blowing a gale from N.W. 31st Lat 38° 50' Long 31° 30' East

Saturday Nov 11th

12 Commences with a gale from W steering E.S.E. very heavy. Boats took in top gallant sails and fly jib one sail in sight Middle Part much the same Latter Part more moderate made all sail steering S.E. wind W too much in sight Lat 38° 15' Long 34° 5'

Sunday Nov 12th

99 Commences with fine weather and a fine breeze from W steering S.E. by E under all sail one ship in sight Middle Part calm Latter Part squally at 1 P.M. called all hands and clothed the top sails blowing a gale from S at 4 P.M. more moderate under all sail wind came to S.W. steering S one ship in sight so ends this day Lat 31° 8' Long 36° 30' East

Monday Nov 13th

100 Commences with fine weather wind S.W. heading S.E. two ships in sight at 5 P.M. took in studding sails Middle Part light winds from S.E. heading S.E. by E Latter Part wind came to S.E. braced round the yards heading E.S.E. by the wind so ends this day one sail in sight Lat 30° 00'

Tuesday Nov 14th

101 Commences with light winds from E backed ship to the South at 4 P.M. wind came to E.S.E. Middle Part wind came to S took in all sail lost top most sail blowing a gale at 1 P.M. fine weather Lat 37° 50' Long 41° 50'

1873 Ship Unear, Sailing, of Amsterdam, to St. Paul

Saturday November 25th

118 Days out Commences with fine weather and a fine breeze from S.W. steering S.E. by compass at 3 P.M. speak Ship Master of New London & month's out at 5 P.M. made the Vol of Amsterdam 35 miles out at 6 P.M. took in sail Latter Part fine weather laying of and on Latter Part a strong breeze from N.W. at 1 P.M. two boats went in a rowing at 8 P.M. again with about 300 fish and a plenty of fish backs so ends steering S.E. the wind bearing W.S.W. 31 miles out one sail in sight Lat 37° 10' Long 48° 00'

Sunday Nov 26th

119 Commences with fine weather and a fine breeze from S.W. steering S.E. by compass the weather changed in evening into Middle Part much the same Latter Part fine weather wind came to the S.W. steering S.E. under all sail so ends fish backs in sight Lat 35° 10' South

Monday November 27th

121 Commences with fine weather and a fine breeze from S.W. ship going S.E. by compass under all sail one fish backs nothing else in sight Latter Part much the same Latter Part fine weather nothing in sight so ends all 35° 10' South

Tuesday Nov 28th

122 Commences with fine weather and a fine breeze from S.W. steering S.E. under all sail nothing in sight but fish backs Middle & Latter Part fine weather and nothing in sight so ends Lat 35° 50' East

Wednesday Nov 29th

123 Commences with thick weather the ship from S.W. ship going S.E. under all sail Middle & Latter Part much the same so ends this day got nothing Lat 35° 40' Long 44° 00'
