

1844 Remarks on board Ship Uucas

193 Days out
Thursday Jan 25th

Commences with squally weather and light winds from E steering by the wind under all sail heading S. S. E. At 7 P.M. finished boiling Middle & Latter Part much the same so ends this fair dinner
Lat 13.00 South Long 149.20 West

174 Thursday Jan 25th

Commences with light breeze from E. S. E. steering by the wind Middle & Latter Part squally tough for sperm oil down between decks so ends this day nothing in sight
Lat 11.40 South Long 149.02 West

175 Friday Jan 26th

Commences with light variable winds from E to S. E. heading by the wind under all sail Middle & Latter Part much the same so ends nothing in sight but hard lines
Lat 10.42 South Long 149.20 West

176 Saturday Jan 27th

Commences with fine weather and light winds from E. S. E. heading S. by the wind under all sail Middle & Latter Part much the same so ends the watch employed in ships duty
Lat 8.45 South Long 149.20 West

177 Sunday Jan 28th

Commences with fine weather and light winds from E heading S. E. by the wind under all sail Middle & Latter Part much the same so ends nothing in sight
Lat 6.53 South Long 149.58 West

178 Monday Jan 29th

Commences with fine weather and light winds from E heading S. E. by the wind under all sail and barometer Middle & Latter Part much the same so ends
Lat 5.46 South Long 149.01

So goes the Uucas and have lines

179 Monday Jan 26th

Commences with fine weather and light winds from S. E. heading S. W. by the wind under all sail Middle & Latter Part much the same the watch employed in ships duty so ends nothing
Lat 3.45 South Long 149.45 West

180 Tuesday Jan 30th

Commences with fine weather and light winds from S. E. steering by the wind under all sail heading S. S. W. nothing in sight Middle & Latter Part much the same so ends the watch employed in ships duty
Lat 2.41 South Long 150.13 West

181 Thursday Jan 1st 1844

Commences with fine weather and light winds from E. S. E. heading S. E. by the wind under all sail nothing in sight and is not like to be Middle & Latter Part much the same so ends all hands employed in taring down the rigging
Lat 1.30 South Long 150.01 West

182 Friday Feb 2nd

Commences with fine weather and light winds from E steering by the wind under all sail at 1 P.M. saw sperm whales lowered three boats and gave chase but got nothing at 4 P.M. took our ass on board and came on board plenty of whales in sight but lost four as Ch. hit Middle & Latter Part much the same so ends the watch employed in ships duty
Lat 9 miles South Long 149.55 West

183 Saturday Feb 3rd

Commences with thick weather and squally at 8 P.M. backed ship to East wind S. S. E. steering by the wind under all sail Middle & Latter Part much the same so ends the watch employed in ships duty
Lat 5.0 miles North Long 150.54 W
